

DID YOU KNOW.....

April 2nd is <u>International Children's Book Day</u>.



First celebrated in 1967, International Children's Book Day is held on the 2nd of April every year in order to promote children's reading and books. This date was chosen in honour of celebrated author, Hans Christian Anderson, creator of such well-known stories as: The Emperor's New Clothes; The Little Mermaid; The Ugly Duckling and many more; and whose birth date was April 2nd.

According to the International Board on Books for Young People (IBBY) website, the benefits of taking part in International Children's Book Day are synonymous with the benefits of reading as a whole including:

- Brain exercise reading engages and exercises the brain, helping it to better make neural connections;.
- Vocabulary improvement the amount of terminology that a child uses and possesses can increase with regular reading;.
- Empathy and imagination reading opens children up to new horizons, helping them think outside the box and engage with the outside world in ways they had not done previously; and.
- Morale improvement it should not be forgotten that reading is fun! Taking part in it will boost a child's morale and uplift their mood.

RAMADAN MUBARAK



Ramadan is a holy month of fasting, introspection and prayer for Muslims, the

followers of Islam. It is celebrated as the month during which Muhammad received the initial revelations of the Quran, the holy book for Muslims.

Fasting is one of the five fundamental principles of Islam. Each day during Ramadan, Muslims do not eat or drink from sunrise to sunset. They are also supposed to avoid impure thoughts and bad behavior. Muslims break their daily fasts by sharing meals with family and friends, and the end of Ramadan is celebrated with a three-day festival known as Eid al-Fitr, one of Islam's major holidays. Ramadan 2021 will begin at sunset on Monday, April 12th and end on Tuesday, May 11th.

EARTH DAY - APRIL 22ND



A massive oil spill in Santa Barbara, California in 1969 prompted the first Earth Day, held on April 22nd, 1970. The goal was to address an

emerging public consciousness about air and water pollution. The EARTHDAY.ORG website explains that: "Groups that had been fighting

individually against oil spills, polluting factories and power plants, raw sewage, toxic dumps, pesticides, freeways, the loss of wilderness and the extinction of wildlife united on Earth Day around these shared common values."

In 1990, Earth Day went global - mobilizing 200 million people in 141 countries and lifting environmental issues onto the world stage."

The COVID-19 pandemic has once again impacted usual Earth Day events such as group community cleanups, however, we can continue to be more aware of our impact on the environment and try changing our habits by practicing the 3 r's: reduce, reuse, recycle. REPORT A POTHOLE OR SINKHOLE

Report a pothole or sinkhole on a municipallyowned street or sidewalk by calling 311 or visit our municipal website to log the location.

Potholes are caused when the asphalt on the surface of a road has deteriorated from the top, but you can still see asphalt underneath.

Sinkholes are caused by erosion from underneath, and when you look into the hole you cannot see any pavement.

To report potholes on a 100-series highway including ramps leading to and from the highway and overpasses, please contact Nova

NEW SIGNAGE IN SIR SANDFORD FLEMING PARK



This summer, you will notice new signage in Sir Sandford Fleming Park advising that BBQs using briquettes or coals are not permitted. Briquettes or wood burning devices contravene the Parks By-Law 600 and is considered an open fire under By-Law O-109.

CHANGES TO ACCESSIBLE PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS (APS) AND PEDESTRIAN PUSH-BUTTONS



Over the next three months, updates are expected to be completed to Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) at 76 signalized intersections across the region.

APS are devices installed at some signalized intersections that assist individuals who are blind or visually impaired to cross the street by providing an audible tone that indicates when the pedestrian signal is activated. Historically, the push-button had to be pressed and held for three seconds to activate the audible tone where APS buttons are present.

At the Feb. 25, 2021 meeting of the Transportation Standing Committee, the committee voted in favour of adopting a single press of the button to activate the APS.

Later this spring, staff will begin making adjustments to traffic signal programming at many locations to remove the requirement for pedestrians to press a button to activate the pedestrian signal between the hours of 6 am and midnight. The push requirement will remain in place between midnight and 6 a.m.

This work is being done based on resident feedback to improve accessibility, including for

those using mobility aids or have other mobility limitations.

ARMDALE ROUNDABOUT CROSSINGS

Installation of pedestrian-activated rectangular rapid-flashing beacons (RRFBs), the same as those installed at the Larry Uteck Roundabout, are scheduled to be installed here in the 2022/2023 construction season.



RRFBs are pedestrian activated crosswalk systems which consist of two rapidly and alternately flashing rectangular amber beacons mounted above the side mounted pedestrian crossing signs. RRFBs can enhance safety at unsignalized intersections and mid-block pedestrian crossings by increasing driver awareness of potential pedestrian conflicts and by improving driver yielding behavior.
