INFORMATION REPORT

ORIGIN

THAT Environment and Sustainability Standing Committee request a staff report on presentation topic for item 10.3.2 about marker recycling.

MOTION PUT AND PASSED.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

The Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, Part XIII Solid Waste Management, Section 335 (a - j) provides Halifax Regional Council with the authority to make by-laws respecting Solid Waste Resource Management.

BACKGROUND

At the March 4, 2021 Environment and Sustainability Standing Committee meeting, information was presented on the benefits of marker recycling by Grade 9 student Alex Xie.

Crayola offers a marker recycling program 'ColourCycle' where those wishing to host a collection site can register as a collection site to ship markers and crayons back to Crayola free of charge. According to Crayola these items are converted into energy and wax compounds for roofing shingles. At the time of this report, Crayola had suspended new registrations and shipments from existing collection sites citing precautions associated with the Coronavirus pandemic. Further details on how to participate in the program were unavailable.

Staples Canada funds an in-store recycling drop-off program² for in writing instruments (markers, highlighters, mechanical pencils, and pens) in partnership with TerraCycle³. There are seven Staples locations in HRM who offer this service. According to the Terracycle website, "the writing instruments are separated by material composition. The separated items are then cleaned, shredded, and made into new recycled products". In 2020 Staples diverted over 1.17 million writing instruments⁴.

Interested organizations also have the option of purchasing TerraCycle collection boxes through Staples at a cost of \$110 (capacity 780 items / \$0.14 per item) or \$190 (capacity 2,100 items / \$0.09 per item). Return shipping is included in this cost.

DISCUSSION

Diversion opportunities for products like markers are highly dependant on the efforts of manufacturers and retailers to create an end market-use. Programs are developed to attract consumers to the products or retail location, and to raise awareness of the environmental initiatives of the company. As these programs are a form of voluntary stewardship, there is no guarantee in their long-term sustainability or if the materials accepted will change.

Given the availability of the free retail sponsored collection at Staples, HRM can promote the diversion of markers and other writing utensils through that program using the Halifax Recycles app and social media posts. Once the ColourCycle program has been reinstated, it can be added as an additional resource.

Solid Waste Education staff visit dozens of schools, libraries and community centres each year. Information on how to become a collection site can be provided to these sites and they can make the decision to participate. Often when collection boxes are 'assigned' to a site (i.e. battery recycling boxes), they are misplaced or not visible. Having each site initiate this program gives more oversight and commitment to making the program work and promoting it with customer and staff.
