LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Outcome Sought:

HRM, through the UN Safe Cities and Safe Public Spaces Programme⁴, could consider the impact of anti-Asian racism on women's experiences of safety in public spaces and explore ways to identify and collect race-based data about these experiences.

Collecting this data would help to achieve one of the goals of the UN Safe Cities programme. "Develop an expanded view of safety by supporting a gender approach across all municipal departments' planning. This includes urban planning, public infrastructure and economic development."

The data may show how anti-Asian racism impacts women's safety in Halifax. For example, the data may quantify and qualify anti-Asian racism incidents experienced by women in the Halifax region".
