






2. Historical Importance



- Camp Hill Cemetery was designed in the Rural Cemetery style (early-to-mid-19th century)
- Located outside of city cores and features elements of English landscape
- Heavily cultivated with fences or hedges, tree belts, grouped flower beds, and shrubs to provide seclusion
- Earliest known example of the Rural Cemetery style in Canada

2. Historical Importance



- Character defining elements include, but are not limited to:
 - Representation of the Rural Cemetery movement;
 - Black iron ornamental fences and granite entryway posts, originally designed by Starr Manufacturing Co.;
 - The configuration of the gravel pathways;
 - Pedestrian connectivity to other public open spaces; and
 - Grave markers of various styles and designs

2. Historical Importance




- Has historical associations to the thousands who are buried there; however, only 5,000 internments are marked
- Known graves include, but are not limited to:
 - Viola Desmond, civil rights activist
 - Members of the No. 2 Construction Battalion
 - Joseph Howe, 4th Premier of Nova Scotia
 - Alexander Keith, businessman and politician
 - Henry Frederick Busch, architect



3. Integrity





- The original cruciform circulation pattern and layout of Camp Hill Cemetery is largely unchanged
- Notable changes include:
 - Circular pathway removed for more burial plots;
 - Flower beds and stands were removed;
 - Summer Street iron grate was removed;
 - Gravel and ash paths were paved; and
 - Office and keepers lodge were demolished

4. Context HAC Score: 10 / 10





- o Camp Hill Cemetery has historical, visual and physical associations with the Commons land
- Provides open space connectivity with the Public Gardens and the Wanders Ground

4. Context HAC Score: 10 / 10



- Place of a reflection and commemoration, as well as a place of horticultural appreciation
- Helps connect residents to local history
- The design of grave markers and landscape design sheds a light on Halifax's social history and cultural values
