Regional Council December 7, 2021

Background

- In October 2019, HAC recommended that three properties near the Carlton / Spring Garden intersection be considered for registration
- These properties were not included in the Carlton Early Victorian Streetscape and are "under threat of loss"
- In November 2019, Regional Council passed the motion to explore their registration potential





Background

- Demolition permits were issued in August 2018 and May 2020
- Both buildings were demolished before research reports and evaluations were complete
- HAC recommended that 1538 and 1540
 Carlton Street no longer have heritage value
- Proceed with the evaluation of 5943
 Spring Garden





1. Age

HAC Score: 9 / 25





1. AgeHAC Score: 9 / 25



- o Bought by Stephen A. Heisler in 1907
- Deed made no reference to existing structures
- McAlpine's City Directory (1907-1908) lists Heisler as the property's occupant

2. Architectural Importance



- Queen Anne Revival style (1880-1915)
- Victorian Era (1837-1900) architecture, though the dwelling was built in the Edwardian Era (1900-1914)
- The style is characterized by asymmetry, dynamic roof shapes, corner towers, bay windows, and ornate detailing

HAC Score: 15 / 20

4a. Architectural Merit (Construction)



- Wood-frame dwelling constructed on a masonry foundation
- Exact framing technique is unknown
- Exterior construction and detailing would have required a skilled builder



HAC Score: 5 / 10

4b. Architectural Merit (Style)



- Good example of the Queen Anne Revival style
- Displays the style's trademark asymmetric appearance, irregular plan, and intricate detailing
- Character defining elements:
 - Truncated hip roof
 - Two-storey bay windows with wood dentils
 - Corner tower with conical roof (front)
 - Projecting bay with conical roof (rear)
 - Pediment gable
 - Front entryway with transom window




HAC Score: 10 / 10

5. Architectural Integrity







- High level of architectural integrity; original footprint and elements have been retained
- Most original windows have been replaced with single-pane windows
- Similar design to the Federal Heritage Building at 2639 Lorne Drive, Halifax, but with less ornate detailing

6. Relationship to Surroundings



- One of the last remaining private residences on Halifax Common lots
- Abuts another Halifax Common residence (5945 Spring Garden)
- Queen Anne building has connections to the registered Early Victorian Streetscape on the southern portion of Carlton
