





Collaboration Advisory Group




Conceptual Model

What is unique about SLWAR?


- 27 Agency Collaborative Housing First Model
- Women with lived experience continue to consult leadership on operations
- One consent form
- Reallocated staff
- SLWAR has it's own referral and matching process

- All intake is through the London Police Service Persons at Risk Program (PAR)
- SLWAR Team Lead meets with the woman and Sgt. Amy Birtch




How SLWAR Works

Conclusion

SLWAR is helping women to:

- Exit homelessness
- Secure permanent housing
- Maintain their housing
- Experience improvements in health and well-being
- Increase their choice and safety related to sex work
- Strengthen relationships with children and natural supports
- Decrease their legal involvement
- Achieve personal goals
- Access supports and services
- Engage in recreational and community activities

Conclusion

SLWAR is helping organizations to:

- Work together to support women involved in street involved sex work
- Engage in joint decision-making and problemsolving
- Build strong relationships
- Improve communication and information sharing



Conclusion

- Findings demonstrate that SLWAR has had a positive impact on women involved with SLWAR, collaborative partners, and the service system.
