SUBJECT:	Consideration of Front Yard Setbacks in C-2C Zone for Case 23245 and Case 22816

<u>ORIGIN</u>

Halifax and West Community Council January 18, 2022, Item 10.1.1.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, Part 1, Clause 25 (c) provides:

25 The powers and duties of a Community Council include

(c) recommending to the Council appropriate by-laws, regulations, controls and development standards for the community.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Officer to consider front yard setbacks in the C-2C Zone through the upcoming amendments as part of Case 23245 and Case 22816.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

On January 18, 2022 Halifax and West Community Council held a public hearing to consider Land Use Bylaw amendments for front yard setbacks in the C-2C (Dutch Village Road Mixed-use) Zone. The Community Council approved the staff recommendation outlined in the staff report dated November 12, 2021¹. During the discussion, the area Councillor suggested further review of the zoning setbacks for Case 23245 and Case 22816 before they go to Regional Council for consideration. The Community Council passed a motion recommending Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Office to consider front yard setbacks in the C-2C Zone through the upcoming amendments as part of Case 23245 and Case 22816.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

No financial implications at this time. The HRM cost associated with processing this planning application can be accommodated with the approved 2021-2022 operating budget for C320 Regional Policy Program.

RISK CONSIDERATION

No risk considerations were identified.
