BLUE-GREEN ALGAE AWARENESS

Watch for blue-green algae from May to October. It is also called cyanobacteria which occurs naturally in surface waters like lakes, ponds, rivers and streams. The toxins in the algae can make people sick and be fatal for pets if ingested. Blue-green algae tends to develop when a period of hot, dry weather is followed by a heavy rainfall. If you think you see blue-green algae, you should treat it as potentially toxic. Report it to your local NS Department of Environment and Climate Change office or call 1-877-936-8476. 2022-23 HRM COMMUNITY GRANTS

The 2022-23 HRM Community Grants Program received 106 applications with a combined total of \$1,172,793.83 in requests. After HRM staff assessment and review by the HRM Grants Committee, 59 awards were approved by HRM Council for a total of \$452,714. Here are the local organizations that were granted awards from this year's program:

- Lawrencetown Sew-ciety Guild \$500 towards the purchase of small equipment.
- Icelandic Memorial Society of Nova Scotia -Markland Settlement - \$2,500 towards settlement site interpretation signs.
- Petpeswick Yacht Club East Petpeswick -\$2,900 towards the sailing club electrical upgrade to address building code compliance.
- **Sheet Harbour Sexual Health Society** \$3,000 to purchase resource materials serving the 2SLGBTQIA+ community.
- Charles Taylor Theatre & Media Arts Association -**East Preston** – \$5,000 towards theatre mentorship production for local Black artists and technicians.
- Conseil Communautaire du Grand-Havre \$5,000 to develop a community on-line platform serving the Acadian and Francophone community.
- **Musquodoboit Trailways Association -**Musquodoboit Harbour – \$7,000 towards the purchase of a storage shipping container.
- **Sheet Harbour Rockets Ballfield** \$12,650 to replace the clubhouse electrical system.
- **Porter's Lake Community Service Association** - \$15,000 towards a roof replacement for the community hall.

2022-23 HRM - GSAR GRANTS

HRM provides operating grants to our volunteer Ground Search and Rescue (GSAR) Teams. These teams provide assistance to all three levels of government in the event of a missing person search, an evacuation, natural or man-made disaster, or evidence search. Although the four organizations are based in predominantly rural locations their search areas cover the entire region and on occasion more than one unit may be called upon to provide volunteer personnel and equipment.
