<u>Halifax Transit</u> will be offering free transit service on Fridays and free ferry service on Saturdays throughout the summer.



SPLASHPADS, OUTDOOR POOLS AND BEACHES



The Bayers-Westwood, George Dixon, Isleville Street, Westmount, and Sackville splashpads are now open for the 2022 season.

The Bedford and Cole Harbour outdoor pools, the <u>Halifax Common splashpad</u>, and all supervised municipal beaches will open for the 2022 season on Friday, July 1st.

Resident are advised that, due to <u>construction</u> of the new Halifax Commons Aquatics Facility, the Halifax Common outdoor pool will remain closed for the 2022 season. Beginning Friday, July 1st, the municipality is offering free swims at the <u>Needham Community Centre pool</u> to minimize disruptions for residents who regularly use the Halifax Common pool.

HOMELESSNESS & ENCAMPMENTS

On May 3rd, Regional Council discussed the issue of homelessness including potential temporary outdoor shelters. The staff report addressed the issue of encampments as follows: "Most stakeholders indicated that the practice of not forcing out those sleeping in deep woods areas and providing supports as possible to them is an approach that should be continued. There was clear feedback from a range of stakeholders that the municipality needs to provide an option for people who need to sleep on public land."

On June 14th, Council approved a motion to endorse proposed criteria and locations in municipal parks for designated camping for those experiencing homelessness. Four areas in total were approved for overnight sheltering. This is in addition to modular units in Halifax and Dartmouth that are both complete (the province's service provider, Out of the Cold, has begun the process of gradually moving individuals into the Halifax modular, while the Dartmouth site is already occupied).

The four areas designated for camping sites for persons experiencing homelessness include Barrington Street Green Space between Cornwallis Street and North Street in Halifax, Lower Flinn Park in Halifax, along with Geary Street Green Space and Green Road Park in Dartmouth. These locations meet specific criteria that is outlined below and will allow 30+people to sleep rough in the community.

- A maximum of four tents per site will be permitted.
- For the locations designated as sheltering places for multiple nights, some form of toilet facility should be provided and, if possible, a water source. These sites should have garbage cans and regular collection and an option for dry goods storage.
- Anyone sheltering in a park will be expected to comply with applicable laws, including provincial and HRM burning restrictions.

Selecting these locations involved specific criteria, including that the sites cannot be:

- within 50 metres of a school, daycare, or adult care facility;
- on active sports fields, dugouts, or bleachers; within horticultural displays or gardens;
- within cemeteries;
- near environmentally or culturally sensitive areas;
- blocking a path or right of access;
- cannot be on bridges, docks, or piers;
- near playgrounds, pools, or splash pads;
- near skateboard parks or sports courts;
- near picnic shelters, gazebos;
- near recreation facilities; or in highly inaccessible spaces for individuals, services, and support providers.

 Signage needs to be posted, maps and information material will be prepared, washrooms and potable water will be provided where it is not already available, along with training for compliance/enforcement Officers and building connections with service providers and navigators.

A staff report has been requested to provide additional analysis and recommendations for actions, including a timeline and plan for supporting the transition and education of people, to be led and delivered by civilian staff.



GRAND OASIS FESTIVAL SERIES

The Halifax Regional Municipality is pleased to host the Grand Oasis Festival Series – a free festival to celebrate music, art, and culture at Grand Parade. The festival takes place from Tuesday, June 21st to Saturday, October 1st.



SPRING GARDEN ROAD BUS-ONLY PILOT



The Spring Garden Road Bus-only Pilot will begin on Monday, July 4th and run until June 2023, with the following adjustments:

- Spring Garden Road, from Queen to South Park streets, will be bus-only from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. each day (including weekends).
- Vehicle access will be maintained on Spring Garden southbound on Birmingham Street, northbound on Dresden Row and northbound on Brenton Street (left turn required at Spring Garden) from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. each day (see attached map).

- Clyde Street will be converted to twoway, between South Park and Brenton streets, to support area circulation.
- Spring Garden Road, from Queen to South Park streets, will reopen to vehicle traffic from 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. each night. Stopping is not permitted on the street outside of designated loading areas. On and offstreet parking (including accessible parking), as well as on-street loading, are located on side streets.
- Cyclists and pedestrians will continue to have access to the street at all times.
- Access to all businesses will be maintained.

This is part of the <u>Imagine Spring Garden Road</u> streetscaping project. Regional Council approved the bus-only pilot in December 2021. Learn more about the pilot <u>here</u>.

Spring Garden Road is a busy and vibrant street, with thousands of people who commute through the area daily. Bus-only lanes help to make transit more reliable. Less traffic means less noise, cleaner air, and a better pedestrian experience.

CN VEGETATION CONTROL



CN Rail's annual Vegetation Control Program (VCP) will run from April to October 2022. A regularly updated schedule is available at www.cn.ca/vegetation.

If not managed properly, trees, brush or other vegetation can severely compromise rail and public safety. Vegetation can impede the view motorists have of oncoming trains and increase the risk of crossing accidents. Moreover, unwanted vegetation can damage the integrity of the railbed, interfere with signals and switches, contribute to track side fires, compromise employee and citizens safety, reduce visibility for train crews at road crossings/train control signals and track side warning devices.

CN's annual vegetation control program is designed to mitigate these risks by managing brush, weeds and other undesirable vegetation.

HALIFAX MURAL FESTIVAL

The Halifax Mural Festival (July 11th – July 17th) is a community-based weeklong event that will bring several artists to add some much-needed colour and flair to Quinpool Road. Over the course of a week, both well-established and emerging artists, local and national, will bring colour to iconic public spaces. Street art rejuvenates structures and beautifies surroundings. Murals inspire connection and help to express a community's values, which in turn improves local business viability. Murals create an opportunity for residents and tourists alike to interact with the city.

The goal is to have 5 to 8 murals of various sizes situated in various locations along Quinpool Road completed by the end of the week. The event will be capped off with a day of programing including: the grand opening of Cogswell Park, live music, outside markets, barbecues, sidewalk sales, art activities, backdoor takeout and more.

SAFE BOATING




It's that time of year when we take to the water for fun and recreation with friends and family. To ensure you stay safe, please read
