#### SILVER SANDS ACCESS

I am happy to share that HRM's court application to open the legal easement access to the Silver Sands beach has been granted by the provincial courts. The judge ruled in favor of HRM – this is a huge win for our community.

It has been brought to my attention that the access is still not consistently available, HRM are aware and are making plans for full restoration of the access. If you notice the access is not available, please feel free to send me an email and I will pass it along to the appropriate staff so that they are aware.

It is my hope that we can resolve this ongoing dispute with the property owner, and I am continuing to work with staff to find an alternative access and parkland acquisition as well. Thank you for your support on this very important space in Cow Bay, District 3 and HRM.

### RECONNECT 2022: HALIFAX PRIDE FESTIVAL



# FREE FARES FRIDAYS AND FREE SAIL SATURDAYS!

Halifax Transit will be offering free transit service (that's buses, ferry, and Access-A-Bus) on FRIDAYS and free Alderney ferry service on SATURDAYS this summer from July 1<sup>st</sup> - August 31<sup>st</sup>!

This initiative was approved by Regional Council in April 2022 and aims to encourage former or new riders to take transit and familiarize residents with the transit service available in your communities.

Active Transportation staff held community engagement sessions in District 3 related to the proposed AT corridor to connect Shearwater Flyer trail to the Dartmouth Harbourfront trail in Woodside. They were well attended and accompanied by an online survey about the project as well.

Jeff did the original artwork when I was
Councillor the first time, so I was thrilled he
would take it on again. This time we have taken
a few extra steps to protect it and hopefully it
will last longer.

I am also pleased to share that the next element of installation to brighten up Quigley's Corner will be large boulders, that reflect the beautiful coastline that plays a huge role in this community. Artwork will be coming later.

The Halifax Regional Municipality is advising residents that speed limits have been, or are about to be, reduced from 50 km/h to 40 km/h on the residential streets off Cow Bay Road.

Neighbourhood speed limit reductions are part of the municipality's ongoing initiatives to improve road safety. All streets with reduced speed limits can be found in the lists below:



The speed limit reduction in these areas are being implemented following provincial approval based on available data and an assessment of roadway characteristics that meet their qualifications.

#### PARKING TICKET FORGIVENESS

Parking violations will be waived with proof of purchase at a local business!

If a resident or visitor makes a \$35+ purchase at a business and receive a parking ticket – the ticket can be submitted along with a receipt from the local business to have the ticket reversed.

Receipts must be submitted online within five business days of ticket issuance, and only one ticket may be cancelled per person per week.

Regional Council approved this Parking Ticket Forgiveness initiative as part of the COVID Business Recovery package. This program is ongoing until September 30<sup>th</sup>.

### **BE AWARE: BLUE-GREEN ALGAE**

Blue-green algae, or cyanobacteria, are naturally found in freshwater environments like lakes, ponds, rivers, and streams. They thrive in warm water and can be harmful to people and fatal for pets.

Algae blooms can look like fine grass clippings in the water, spilled paint, pea soup or sometimes like a thick scum on the surface. Algae mats can look like clumps of vegetation, and can appear black, brown, or dark green in the water. On the shoreline they may appear brown or grey.


Here are some tips for staying safe this summer:

- When visiting a lake, river, stream, or pond, always scan the water and shoreline before entering the water or letting children or pets play in it.
- Pets may be attracted to the smell of algae mats.
- Do not allow pets to play with or eat algae mats, as it could be fatal.
- If a beach is closed, do not swim or play near the water.
- Swimming in contaminated water may cause itchy and irritated eyes and skin, including hives, rashes, or blisters.
- People or animals that consume contaminated water are at risk of headaches, fever, diarrhea, vomiting, cramps, muscle, joint pain, and liver damage.

• Do not drink or cook with water where bluegreen algae are present. Boiling water will not remove toxins.
