NWCC UPDATE

The North West Community Council (NWCC) met on Monday, July 18th to consider the following:

Public Hearing held on <u>Case 21826</u>: <u>Amending Development Agreement for 771-</u> <u>819 Bedford Highway and 12-32 Esquire Lane,</u> <u>Bedford</u>. NWCC approved the development agreement to allow additional commercial uses, expansion of the commercial area within existing buildings, construction of new motel buildings and accessory buildings, subdivision of the lands, and a reduction to the size of the non-disturbance area.

Variance Appeal was heard on <u>Case 24176</u>: <u>Appeal of Variance Refusal – 1236 Beaver</u> <u>Bank Road, Beaver Bank</u>. NWCC overturned the Development Officer's decision and granted the variance to allow for the shipping container to be located 1.5' from the sideyard with minimum separation distance of 5'. AUGUST 1st is NATAL DAY!

Natal Day was first celebrated on June 21st, commemorating the founding of Halifax in 1749. Dr. John P. Martin, town historian, wrote about how Natal Day celebrations shifted to August in his book "The Story Of Dartmouth." The first annual Natal Day started in the summer of 1895 when Dartmouth townsfolk decided to have their own Natal Day, with the holiday date coinciding with the inauguration of the first train arriving on the new railway line in the area. As the new railway branch was scheduled to be completed by August of 1895, preparations to host a summer carnival began earlier in the same year. By June, it was evident that the railway branch would not be finished that year. The locals and the Dartmouth Committee went ahead with their celebration plans for Natal Day at First Lake in August.

In 1906, a half-holiday was declared by Halifax on the same day as Dartmouth's Natal Day.

In August 2022, the Annual Dartmouth Natal Day Road Race and Pepsi Natal Day Parade will be held to celebrate this special day.

AUGUST 1st – Emancipation day



August 1st is Emancipation Day. It marks the actual day in 1834 that the <u>Slavery Abolition</u> <u>Act</u> of 1833 came into effect across the British Empire and the practice of slavery officially ended for millions of African people and their descendants in Canada and around the world.

On March 24th, 2021, members of parliament unanimously voted to designate August 1st as Emancipation Day in Canada. On April 13th, 2021, the province of Nova Scotia followed the federal declaration by officially introducing <u>legislation</u> to annually recognize August 1st as Emancipation Day in Nova Scotia.

Each August 1st, Canadians are invited to reflect, educate and engage in the ongoing fight against anti-Black racism and discrimination.

Emancipation Day celebrates the strength and perseverance of Black communities in Canada.

UPDATE - WAVERLEY ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Thank you, residents of Waverley, for your patience as many of you were severely inconvenienced by the closure of the Waverley Road this summer due to construction. This work involved necessary guardrail repair and more importantly, the building of the retaining wall.

HRM should have provided more notice and communicated earlier on the conditions which warranted this unexpected full closure of the road, deemed necessary for the contractor to complete the work safely. We have waited quite some time to see an investment in this road infrastructure and it is about time.

The current status of this project is:

- guiderail and erosion protection work on 3 of the guiderail sites has been completed and the 4th site (near civic 2342) is progressing well.
- retaining wall has been installed
- road opened to one lane of stop-and-go traffic as of 7:00 p.m. Friday, July 29th
- from 7:00 p.m. Friday, July 29th until 7:00 p.m. Friday, August 5th, temporary traffic signals will direct traffic flow at the work site near 2342 Waverley Road.
- Crews will continue to be on-site during weekdays until Friday, August 12th.

 temporary traffic signals will be removed on August 5th and any outstanding work will be done using stop-and-go traffic with traffic control personnel on-site.

I am pleased to see this much-needed work getting completed this summer, for the safety of all road users in the area.

HRM RECEIVES ISO 37120 PLATINUM CERTIFICATION

On July 12th, Halifax Regional Municipality received ISO 37120 Platinum Certification from the World Council on City Data (WCCD). This certification recognizes the high caliber of the Halifax Regional Municipality's data, which is reflected in its reporting of 90 indicators in accordance with ISO 37120 for the 2020/21 fiscal year.

The WCCD is a non-profit organization that administers <u>ISO 37120 – Sustainable Cities</u> – the first globally comparative international standard on city indicators. There are over 100 cities currently certified, representing 40 countries with 30 Canadian cities having achieved Platinum Certification.

The globally standardized WCCD indicators allow for globally comparative benchmarking, enabling administration to continue making

evidence-based decisions, while tracking progress against our peers.

"On behalf of the World Council on City Data, I am pleased to award Mayor Savage and the Halifax Regional Municipality with WCCD's ISO 37120 Certification, at the highest, Platinum level. As is clear from the municipality's exceptional performance across a wide array of indicators – and its dedicated, data-driven staff – Halifax is a leader in Canada and on the global stage. Of the WCCD indicators for the 2020/21 fiscal year, the municipality excelled in the following:

SUMMER SUNSHINE CONCERT SERIES



PUBLIC ART PROPOSALS



Halifax Regional Municipality is seeking public art proposals to be integrated in the new Halifax Common Aquatics Facility.

The <u>Halifax Common Aquatics Facility</u> project will include a 13,500 square foot pool with capacity for 450 people, a new playground, and a year-round pavilion with a community room, kitchenette, modular stage for performers, and natural shade areas from tree groves and overhand features of the structure. It is anticipated the new facility will be open to the public in summer 2023.

The new Aquatics Facility will offer an opportunity for qualified artists to design, fabricate, and install public art. Successful artists will work in collaboration with the municipality's project team.

The deadline for <u>submissions</u> is September 19th.
