#### Recommendations

That the Transportation Standing Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Officer to draft amendments to By-law T-1000 and Administrative Order 39 as set out in Attachment A of this report.

#### Removal of Conditional License

- Removes the difficult path for taxi drivers to become licensed
- Takes away the extensive struggle of reaching 600hour requirement for National Certificate Program
- Allows for a quicker transition to a permanent driver
- Improves timelines for drivers, providing more opportunities for owners and brokers to engage drivers more quickly
- Aligns more with the requirements of TNC service, and Industry



#### **Overview of TNC Driver Requirements**

- A valid and current, unrestricted driver's license issued by the Province of Nova Scotia
- Minimum of three years' driving experience
- Within 30 days of approval to be a TNC Driver, the following original documents must be provided to the TNC:
  - Criminal Record Check;
  - Vulnerable Sector Check;
  - Child Abuse Registry Check
- Provide TNC with a driver's abstract for the class of license prescribed by the Classification of Drivers' Licenses Regulations, N.S., dated within 30 days of approval and then annually thereafter.

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## Removal of Winter Driving Course

- Elimination of the winter driving course
- No benefit online only
- Removal of additional charges to potential drivers
- Not a requirement of the TNC service, or throughout Industry



## Removal of Driver Knowledge Exams

- This would not require an amendment. Testing is recommended, but change is needed to current testing:
  - Streets and Roads testing not required GPS equipment and tablets used in vehicles;
  - Buildings and Common Locations GPS and tablets provide this information;
  - Bylaw and Admin Order knowledge is responsibility of drivers and brokers
- Reduced cost to drivers
- New training program will be more aligned with the role of a driver.



## **New Training Program**

- Centralized training to align with Industry
- Inclusive topics that are specific to role:
  - Diversity & Inclusion
  - Culture
  - Customer Service
  - Ethics
  - Code of Conduct as it relates to the bylaw
- Provides drivers tools needed to provide customer high service standards
- Aligns further with a TNC Driver.



#### **Driver Fees – Taxi vs TNC Drivers**

| Fee Type                   | Taxi Driver Cost | TNC Driver Cost |
|----------------------------|------------------|-----------------|
| English Proficiency Test   | \$103.50         | -               |
| Criminal Record Check      | \$50             | \$50            |
| Child Abuse Registry Check | FREE             | FREE            |
| Drivers Abstract           | \$19             | \$19            |
| Passport Photos            | \$20             | -               |
| Taxi Application Fee       | \$50             | -               |
| Testing                    | \$207            | -               |
| Winter Driving Test        | \$50             | -               |
| Renewal Fee                | \$100            | -               |
| TOTAL                      | \$599.50         | \$69            |



## Fee Differences – TNC, Broker & Drivers

 Annual fee for a TNC is based on the number of vehicles in the fleet:

| Number of Vehicles | Annual Fee |
|--------------------|------------|
| 1 – 10 Vehicles    | \$2,000    |
| 11 – 25 Vehicles   | \$5,000    |
| 26 – 100 Vehicles  | \$15,000   |
| 100+ Vehicles      | \$25,000   |

- Taxi Brokers pay an annual fee of \$300
- We are recommending no change at this time to these fees.
