



- Hezekiah and Estella McAlpine purchased the property in 1898 and operated the printing press out of the home
- Charles and Annie McAlpine purchased the property in 1904
- The family company continued to produce directories
 until 1926



3. Significance of Architect / Builder

- Built by Master-Builder Samuel Manners Brookfield.
- Nationally noteworthy architect who also built the Dingle Tower, the Freemason's Hall, and All Saints Cathedral, among others





4a. Architectural Merit (Construction)



- Light-frame wood construction in an L-shaped Plan, clad in wooden shingles
- Built on a masonry foundation with brick and coursed rubble





4b. Architectural Merit (Style)



- Second Empire style home, a style popular between 1860-1880 in Nova Scotia
- Most noteworthy aspects of the style are the mansard roof and richly ornamented door and windows
- One of only few Second Empire homes in the neighbourhood, and the best example


