
Origin

On January 11, 2022, the following motion of Regional Council was put and passed:

The report should be referred to the Heritage Advisory Committee for evaluation.



Location








1. Age




- Property was built between 1888 and 1890
- Built in response to the original Anglican church having burned down in 1888.



2a. Historical Importance





- Johnstons donated the land in 1842 for the construction of the Little St John's Church
- Little St. John's Church destroyed by fire in 1888.
- The local Anglican congregation built a new church on the same property, in 1890, the Church of St Nicholas.
- In 1919, Rev. Arthur H. Tyers was appointed rector of the Parish and he remained so for twenty-six years.



2a. Historical Importance




The new St. Nicholas in Westwood Hills (2021)

- New St Nicholas Church in Westwood Hills was completed in 2008.
- Old St Nicholas Church rented to St. Gabriel Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahido Church in 2010
- Old St Nicholas Church sold to St Gabriel Church in 2019



3. Significance of Architect/Builder

- Original builder unknown
- St. Nicholas Church was built by the local parishioners

4a. Architectural Merit [Construction Type]





- Two-storey building of light-frame, wooden construction.
- Built atop a masonry foundation of coursed rubble

4b. Architectural Merit [Style]






Northern Elevation

Rolled glass in lancet windows

- Late Example of Gothic Revival style
- Notable character defining elements:
 - Surrounding cemetery with headstones;
 - Twin vestibules on the northern elevation with original arched wooden double doors
 - Rolled glass in lancet windows;
 - Small belltower at the western end of the roof.

5. Architectural Integrity





- Brick chimney added in 1949
- Western foundation wall parged with cement
- Vinyl siding installed in 1980s
- Asphalt shingle roof was once cedar shingle



6. Relationship to Surrounding Area



- Prominent position as a landmark along Hammonds Plains Road
- Critical to community development pattern
