MARCH IS FRANCOPHONIE MONTH



March is <u>Francophonie Month</u>, celebrating the French language and diverse Francophonie cultures through cultural activities held worldwide.

March 20th has been observed worldwide as International Francophonie Day since 1988. The date commemorates the establishment of the Agence de Coopération Culturelle et Technique, the precursor to the <u>International Organization of La Francophonie</u>, the organization representing countries and regions where French is the first or customary language.

Today, with 300 million speakers worldwide, French is the fifth most spoken language in the world; La Francophonie has 88 member states and governments.

URBAN DESIGN AWARDS: 2023 CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS





The municipality is calling for submissions to the Urban Design Awards – a celebration of urban design excellence in the Halifax region.

To qualify for an award, projects must have been completed after January 1st, 2018, and meet one of the nine following awards categories (each with different eligibility requirements for award selection):

- Urban Design Plans
- Urban Architecture
- Landscape Architecture and Civic Design Projects
- Urban Elements
- Housing Solutions
- Community Connections and Initiatives
- Heritage Restoration Projects
- Heritage Adaptive Re-use Projects
- Student Projects

The submission fee is \$345 (including taxes) but is waived for non-profit and student projects. A panel of four independent jurors will evaluate the submissions, and an awards ceremony will take place on Monday, June 26th at the Halifax Central Library. HALIFAX TRANSIT ROUTE CHANGES

Halifax Transit recently implemented further conventional bus service reductions due to current staffing issues.

As of Monday, February 27th Halifax Transit temporarily suspended service on three bus routes, made schedule adjustments to three routes, and removed trips from 30 routes. These service reductions are new and replace several of the trips impacted by the service reductions introduced in November 2022. More details are available on halifax.ca/servicechanges.

The service reductions have been developed with consideration for passenger impact with no community completely losing service during these changes. The service reductions will be in place until late summer 2023. If recruitment continues at the current pace, Halifax Transit is planning to return to regular service levels.

Halifax Transit has continued to work to improve staffing levels. From September to December 2022, 35 new Bus Operators have been hired and trained. Hiring is ongoing this year with new training courses hosted every three weeks.

ELECTRIC BUSES



Most of Halifax Council and some of our Transit staff rode a demo version of our new electric buses

from Nova Bus. We've ordered 60 EV buses and the first 30 should arrive in September.

There are MANY benefits - environmentally, financially, and socially. There's a huge reduction in GHG emissions from our current diesel buses. They are quieter and will give pedestrians and patio patrons a way better auditory experience as they cruise down our mainstreets. They also require less maintenance and are cheaper to operate.

They charge in 5 hours or less, and can run from ~350 kms in the winter to ~500 kms in the summer (good for about 80% of our current bus routes).



Land Acknowledgement

The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People.

Halifax is committed to strengthening its relationship with Indigenous communities and honouring the significant contributions of Indigenous peoples. Another way the municipality has demonstrated this is by formalizing the official Land Acknowledgement:

"The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People."

Making a respectful Land Acknowledgement now, remains a way to express gratitude and respect to Indigenous peoples for being stewards of the land we live and work on. It is a crucial step in reconciliation.

In Nova Scotia, we are all Treaty People; with that comes roles and responsibilities.
