ELECTRIC BUS DEMO



We had the opportunity to have a test drive in an electric bus. The first 30 are set to be delivered in September. They are very quiet, no smelly fumes, and powerful. Range depends on different factors, but the majority will be able to make their "runs" in a single charge (between ~350km-450km). Charging takes about 6 hours.

These buses will be game changers in our city, making our streets nicer for people, and buses cleaner for the environment. The garage is going through a retrofit right now for charging and maintenance thanks to federal and provincial funding. 3

2023/24 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

Regional Council is continuing to review each business unit's proposed budget, hearing from residents about their priorities and making decisions about how we can continue to offer vital services while keeping tax rates low. On March 29th, we will review all the proposed cuts and added expenses – the Budget Adjustment List.

Full approval of the 2023/24 Budget will occur on Tuesday, April 25th.

Residents will be given an opportunity to speak directly to Regional Council during the Budget process. There will be time set aside for the public to provide insight and comments. There are two participation options:

- Registered speakers (recommended): Residents can register until 4:30 p.m. the business day prior to the meeting. For any questions about registration, please contact the Clerk's Office at 902.490.4210 or by email at <u>clerks@halifax.ca</u>.
- 2. Non-registered speakers: During each meeting, after all registered speakers have been called, the Chair will call three times to ask if there is anyone else present who would like to speak.

LITTER CLEAN UP RESOURCES



Residents and groups looking to clean up litter in their communities can access programs supported by HRM Solid Waste Resources. Between the months of April to November, residents of Halifax can register with the Great Nova Scotia Pick Me Up (GNSPMU) by visiting their website. GNSPMU is coordinated by Divert Nova Scotia and is supported in part by HRM. Upon registration, residents can pick up their free litter cleanup kit, which consists of litter bags and nitrile gloves, at their local Halifax Public Library or at one of the three Customer Service Centres located throughout HRM. In addition to providing litter kits, HRM also provides three different disposal options for residents participating in the GNSPMU program. These disposal options include:

- 1. Placing the materials curbside to be collected on your next garbage collection day if it does not exceed curbside bag limits.
- 2. Taking the materials directly to the Otter Lake landfill for disposal. HRM will waive tipping fees for any groups or residents who are registered with the GNSPMU.
- 3. Residents can also get the materials picked by HRM road operations. Residents who choose this disposal option must contact 311 two weeks prior to their litter clean up date to help ensure that the materials are collected.

Residents and groups who are looking to complete litter cleanups during the winter months can contact <u>wasteless@halifax.ca</u> directly to access litter kits and to arrange for pickup from their cleanup event. SPRING WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

To minimize potential damage to municipal roads, the Halifax Regional Municipality has introduced its annual spring weight restrictions, which began on Sunday, March 5th.

These restrictions are for heavy vehicles travelling on municipally maintained roads. Residents can view which roads are exempt from spring weight restrictions on this <u>map</u>.

The municipality's spring weight restrictions are consistent with those of the Nova Scotia Department of Public Works. More details of vehicle restrictions can be found online.

NEIGHBOURHOOD SEED KITS

Are you and your neighbours interested in building relationships in your community through growing vegetable gardens?

Neighbourhood Seeds is a program to help foster community connection through the shared activity of vegetable gardening. You can apply with at least one other neighbour and receive free seeds for roughly 30 households in your neighbourhood.

Applications will be evaluated on their strength to make connections in the neighbourhood. Connect with your neighbours by sharing gardening advice, asking questions, showing your progress, or swapping recipes.

JUSTFOOD ACTION PLAN

With 1 in 5 households struggling to put food on the table, HRM's Government Relations and External Affairs team presented our first food strategy on Tuesday. The plan includes initiatives like advancing community garden programs, maximizing HRM assets for production, access and literacy and creating a community food initiatives fund.

Regional Council approved the first phase of the plan (Part A) on Tuesday, which puts forward 56 recommendations to remove barriers to accessing healthy food in the municipality. You can read the full staff report <u>here</u>.

NEW DATASET AVAILABLE ON OPEN DATA

The Halifax Regional Municipality has released a new dataset on <u>Open Data</u>, on transit shelters and modified four existing datasets <u>PPL&C Building Permits</u>, <u>PPL&C</u> <u>Construction Permits</u>, <u>PPL&C Engineer Permits</u>, <u>PPL&C</u> <u>Land Use Approvals Permits</u> as part of an ongoing commitment to provide public access to data created and managed by the municipality. This brings the total number of Open Data datasets to 201.

A wide range of data can be sourced for free through the catalogue. New data releases occur several times throughout the year, with the most recent release on November 30th, 2022.
