

Towards a more equitable solution


Winter parking ban

- After a snowfall, Halifax bans street parking for needed snow clearing
- Ban applied citywide overnight
- Much better than the model it replaced, but there are still problems

458 tickets per night in 2022—4122 total



554 tickets per night in 2023—3881 total



- Longstanding problem for residents who can <u>least</u> afford it
- Major problem for snow removal crews

Why does the problem persist?

- Residents require cars but can only street park
- No accessible offstreet parking in many areas
- No <u>affordable</u> offstreet parking in many areas
- Housing crisis has made it worse

What do other cities do?

- Montreal, QC
 - Parking bans <u>selectively applied</u> to residential streets using temporary signage (7AM to 7PM or 7PM to 7AM)
 - Residents park on neighbouring streets
 - 2,318 free parking spaces offered in municipal lots during snow clearing

- Ottawa, ON
 - Parking bans <u>selectively applied</u> to residential streets using temporary signage
 - Free parking at five lots



- St. John's, NL
 - Bans <u>selectively applied</u> to some streets at night according to an online schedule (by 3pm day before)
 - Free parking at six lots

"If you do not have a private driveway, we suggest you use a public parking lot. The City of St. John's owns parking lots that are free to use from 9 p.m. to 7 a.m."

Snow Removal Today

Motorists are advised that snow removal and/or street widening operations are scheduled from **Saturday**, **March 4 2023 at 11:00 pm until Sunday**, **March 5 2023 at 6:00 am**, and vehicles must be removed during snow removal operations. To avoid being ticketed or towed, vehicles should be moved from the following 18 streets before the operations begin.

Street name (segment)

Avalon St (Calver Ave-Goodridge St)

Beaumont St (St. Michael's Ave-End)

Blatch Ave (Merrymeeting Rd-Freshwater Rd)

Calver St (Mayor Ave-Newtown Rd)

Cook St (Merrymeeting Rd-Freshwater Rd)

Edinburgh St (Empire Ave-Calver Ave)

Edinburgh St (Salisbury St-Salisbury St)

Howley Ave Exten (Aldershot St-Newtown Rd)

- Portland, Maine
 - City-wide overnight parking ban after storms (9PM to 6AM)
 - Free overnight parking at all <u>city schools</u>, community centres, and stadiums (until 7AM)

"The City offers <u>numerous free options</u> for parking on the peninsula during a snow ban. These lots are available after 5 pm on weekdays on the day a ban is called unless otherwise posted."

Key Themes

- Street parking is <u>not a choice</u> for many
- City website provides residents with alternatives
- Free offstreet parking during bans
- Selective clearing of residential streets

Solutions for Halifax

- 1) Provide Resources
- Currently, no alternative parking options on halifax.ca for residents who only street park

Think Before You Park webpage on Halifax.ca assumes everyone has offstreet parking



Solutions for Halifax

- 2) Provide Alternatives
- Offstreet parking at Halifax <u>public schools</u> and other city owned property
- Monitor using the Hotspot parking app
- Free or for a small fee

Solutions for Halifax

- 3) Selective Parking Bans
- Overnight bans applied to key transit routes
- Selective bans applied to residential streets prior to clearing
- Residents move cars to neighbouring streets (like summer street cleaning)

Concluding thoughts

- Street parking is not a choice for many
- Supporting these residents benefits everyone
- Small <u>but fixable</u> problem
- Housing crisis + increasing density = more residents with only street parking
