

Gentlemen:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of a letter to me of July 7th, 1915, from Mr. L. Fred. Monaghan, City Clerk, enclosing record of proceedings of the Council of the City of Halifax at its Meeting held on Tuedday, the 6th day of July, 1915, at which Meeting a Resolution was passed dismissing me from my Office of Assistant Gity Assessor, and also tendering to me the sum of \$287.50, the same being amount of three months salary in lieu of notice of dismissal, and which tender was forthwith refused by me.

I now present myself, with this demand, for the purpose of performing my duties as such Assistant City Assessor, and I do hereby request the Mayor, Board of Control and the Council of the City of Halifax to forthwith restore me to my Office as said Assistant City Assessor, the duties pertaining to which Office I am now and have always been ready and willing to perform and discharge as by law required.

ABATTOIR.

The Board resumes consideration of the proposition of George Wootten for construction of an abattoir and for concessions from the City. Heber Hartlen and George A, Wootten are present. Mr. Wootten addressed the Board. Mr. Wootten quotes section 6 of By Law No 5 of the City Health Board as follows :- "No blood or any other refuse of any nature or kind shall be permitted to pass or espape into the public sewers, or into any stream or water course."

The City Engineer verbally reports that his estimate of \$1500. to \$2000. for taking care of drainage from the abattoir relates only to a private drain and that the construction of a public sewer from the proposed site via Longard Road to Bedford Basin would cost \$6500.

The Secretary is instructed to telegraph for informatio

from the Cities of Montreal and Toronto as to the annual consumption of water by their abattoirs; the total cash paid yearly to waid cities for water and the amount of cash exemption, if any, on water account.

At request of Mr. Wootten the following memorandum which Mr. Wootten declined to sign is read -

Halifax, Aug. 12 ,1915. MARITIME ABATTOIR COMPANY.

PROPERTY : Say 5 acres, more or less with a comparatively new, modern cottage about three years old, solid concrete building: size 25 X 55 ft. built within the past few years on modern lines, equipped with rail for hanging cattle. This concrete building is at present on the old slaughter-This concrete building is at present on the said building house side and it is proposed to remove the said building to the new proposed site on the North West Corner of Bismark Streat and Longard Road.

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LOCATION:

West off Longard Road running a distance of say, 570 ft. along Bismark Street; thence running at right angles in a Northerly direction until it intersects the I. C. R. Cotton Factory Siding; thence Easterly along the Railway Boundary line for a distance until it interescts Longard Foad; thence Southerly 390 ft. to place beginning This track will give us an opp rtunity of bringing full carloads alongside of our buildings: besides this our property is less thal 1200 ft. from the shore of gedford Easin, which would give us opportunities for water privilege for freight competition in the future, if necessary; besides being conveniently situated for draining and sewerage purposes into the Harbor. In planning our building we we propose there will be easy excess for local cartages of any part of the City.

PROPOSITION.: We propose building a concrete structure 120 X 76 ft. with basement, ground and first floors for the purpose of killing and cold storage facilities for meats, dairy product eggs, fruit, vegetables, etc., besides this building we propose having a separa te building for the machinery and rendering plat and for the manufacture of fertilizer from the offals, with a capital of \$150,000. with 1500 shares @ \$100. per share.

REMARKS.: From the number of cattle, calves, sige, lambs, etc that is being killed in out slaughter house, it would appear that with economical experienced management utilizing the entire of al, that an investment in this concern would wield a good return, besides doing a good work in assisting the public health authorities in regulating supply of pure meat.

The plants will be constructed, equipped and operate conforming with the Cold Storage Act of Canada, The Meat and Canned Food's Act, governing the inspection of meats. The schedule prices for Cold Storages as adopted by the Cold stroage Act, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa. The charges for killing to be on a basis as charged by Toronto Cavac Abatteir and other Public Abatteirs in Canada.

Read the following paragraph of Controller Mokeen's report "lat in respect to an outstanding disputed claim of Heber Hartlen against the City the Abattoir Company Pramotors undertake on their part before tha above terms and conditions are entered into to settle and dispose of Mr. Hartlen's claim to the satisfaction of the City". 



Before any definite conclusion could be arrived at to ensure the city being fully protected, it was decided to have the City Solicitor and City Engineer go further into same and endeavor to so arrange this portion of the recommendation so that the high service, from which the water supply will be obtained, will be interfered with as little as possible.

The suggestion was made that the Company instal a suitable pumping equipment to get their entire supply in salt water and have the City make some contribution towards cost of such an outfit.

It was decided to leave with the City Solicitor and City Engineer, with the assistance of any of the members of the Board required, to properly draft a full recommendation for presentation to CityCouncil at the special meeting called for Thursday evening, 19th inst. to deal with same.

The Board decides to meet at 11 o'clock on Thursday morning to go over and confirm draft report.

City Auditor. Sir:-

I beg to hand you herewith bill of costs of Messrs. Lumley & Lumley, on which there appears a blaance due them of £142. 6. 9. As you mere under the impression which I shared that all the costs in this had been paid, I wish to make the following explanation to be laid before the Board of Control -

I was in England when the bill was sent here by Messrs. Lumley. At the same time that it was presented, as I understand, Mr. Allison presented his bill for the taxed costs of the Car Company. When I returned from England I was informed that all the costs were wither settled or in course of settlement, and that all that was necessary was that some legislation sould be obtained legalizing payments that had been made.

Messrs. Lumley's own bill I never saw and I supposed that everything had been settled except the necessary legislation. I prepared legislation authorizing payment of the amount which I was told was required. After this legislation had passed I received a letter from Messrs. Lumkey requesting payment of the balance of their account. I immediately consulted with you, and finding that there was evidently some confusion between the taxed

costs on the other side and the amount of our own solicitor's charges. I write Lumley &Lumley asking for a full statement of their account, which I now hand you, and from which it appears that their bill for which we are liable amounted to £392. 6. 9., of which £250 was paid by us, leaving a balance of £142. 6. 9., above stated.

This amount has now been owing for some time, and they are asking me to have it closed as soon as possible. As the bill is undoubtedly due and will have to be paid, I presume the only thing to be done is to follow the practice pursued in respect to the former payments, namely to borrow the money and include it in next year's estimates or cover it by special legislation.
