On motion of Comm'rs. Hatfield and Hayes the report was adopted. TRANSPORTATION CEREBRAL PALSY CASES:

Commissioner Anderson stated that Dr. Crosby had asked him if the Board would be willing to assume the responsibility for transportation of Cerebral Palsy students to St. Francis School which had been undertaken

There being some difference of opinion in regard to the organization which had agreed to sponser this transportation and the matter was deferred until next meeting pending further information by Commissioner Anderson. ANNUAL REPORTS:

The Chairman thought our Annual Report was a very poor looking affair, thought it might be gone over and some of the things eliminated and other things put in which would give a better picture of what we were doing. He also thought the circulation should be extended.

It was moved that the Supervisory Staff be asked to submit a dummy report showing what improvements might be made in the book for next year. Comm'r. Dunlop asked to be recorded against this, as he felt the Supervisors had a full time job in supervising the schools.

PENSIONS - OFFICIALS & STAFF:

The Secretary was directed to confer with the City and ascertain what steps it would be necessary for us to take to have our officials and staff taken on City Pension Fund, also in regard to adjustment of pensions of Secretary-Treasurer and Attendance Officer.

MEMBERSHIP BOARD OF TRADE:

Moved by Comm'r. Zive, seconded by Comm'r. Cowan that the Supervisor be authorized to apply for membership in the Board of Trade, membership dues to be paid for by the Board as it was thought such a connection would be of some considerable benefit to the Board.

AFRICVILLE SCHOOL:

The Supervisor reported that the transfer of Africville Pupils to City Schools had been carried out without any great trouble and things seemed to be working quite satisfactorily and that no complaints had been received.
