I am writing you this letter to inform you of my case.

As I have been a person who has been through the Halifax Explosion. and have had a compound fractured skull. and have not received even a penny for injuries which has caused me very much pain and sickness.

I have been taking epileptic spells quite often and the Drs. claim it is from my

injury that causes me to take them and said I am entitled to a pension.

Now the Drs. home in Halifax have told me that in order to receive my pension I should have had my head opened up after the wound was all healed and had a bone grafted in my head. I was about twelve years old when the explosion occurred and as my head was all healed I cannot understand why I should have it opened again to have a bone grafted in my head as the Drs. in Halifax said they didn't

even know if the operation would be successful or not and I sure had gone through plenty then without having it opened and not even knowing if I would ever recover or not.

My head sure bothers me and I dont see why Im not entitled to a pension when the Drs. in Halifax said if I had that bone grafted in my head I could claim a pension.

I dont see why I was shut of the list for a person in my condition and still suffering like I do through my wound why is it if I had gone through

more I could get a pension when I know I sure deserve it now.

My Mother has sure tried time and time again to claim a pension for me and the only satisfaction she ever could get was I had to have the wound opened in order to receive money. so I sure would like to know more about it if possible.

Of course its a number of years back now but Ive had no luck in getting satisfaction from Halifax in regards to my case.

I think something should be done about it for Im
