Dear Mr. Bethune:.

This will confirm my interview of Thursday morning with you and Mr. Boyle in connection with the transfer of the authority under the Commission's Yown Planning Scheme from the Commission to the City of Halifer.

As expressed to you we had hoped that the City of Halifar Town Planning Scheme would have been in force by this time, and although the soning and planning scheme has been adopted by Resolution of the Council, we understand that the dotails of the scheme have not yet been completed.

Under the City Master Plan which has been adopted in principle by the Council, and of which the Town Planning scheme now being prepared by the City is part, it was recommended that the Hallfax Heliof Commission scheme should be adopted as it stands.

The zoning resolution above referred to provides some modification of our plan as regards commercial and residential sections which we are gled to accept.

We understand that you will propero a bill, with other City legislation, to provide for the repeal of Sections 11 to 25 of the Relief Commission Act and transfer the Town Planning regulations of the Halifax Relief Commission scheme to the authority of the City, safeguarding the present control of the so-called devastated area pending the completion of the comprehensive Town Planning Scheme for the City of Halifax as a whole.

To His Worship the Mayor and Members of the Committee on Works.

Gentlemen: JAN 6 3 50 PM 1948

I had a conversation with Mr. Tibbs recently regarding the giving up of control in certain matters by the Relief Commission in favor of the City. It will be necessary to secure legislation to repeal sections 11 to 25 of the Halifax Relief Commission Act and also to transfer the Town Planning Regulations of the Halifax Relief Commission scheme to the authority of the Town Planning Board of the City in order to safeguard the present control of the so-called "devastated area", pending the completion of the comprehensive Town Planning Scheme for the City of Halifax as a whole.

The sections of the Act above referred to deal with the following matters:

Section 11: definition of the devastated area. authority in the Commission to lay out Section 12: and open, etc., streets in this area. Section 13: authority to raise or lower the level of streets. Section 14: authority to temporarily close streets. Section 15: authority to use steamrollers on the streets. Section 16: obstructions on streets prohibited. Section 17: authority to open streets. Section 18: title to streets. Section 19: authority to grade streets. Section 20: authority to relocate or close streets. authority to divert private or public Section 21: sewers. Section 22: same respecting water mains and hydrants. Section 23: a general section. Section 24: paramount authority to build buildings of material approved by Commission authority to amend, repeal or add to Section 25: Part X of the City Charter.

Many of these provisions are now in the Halifax City Charter as powers of the City and I think if they are repealed insofar as the Relief Commission is concerned the City's authority will then automatically arise.
