AND WHEREAS, the investigation at presnet being conducted is apparently concerned only with the responsibility for the collision which resulted in the explosion, which, in the opinion of the public, is the least important of the contributing causes;

AND WHEREAS, it may be that an investigation into all the causes can only be properly held by a commission appointed by the Federal or even the Imperial Government,

THEREFORE RESOLVED, that this Board request the Dominion Government to take such steps as are necessary to fully ascertain all the causes of the disaster and also what measures should be taken to prevent a recurrence
