

RELIEF ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

The City Council.

Gentlemen:-

On the 29th inst. the members of the Halifax Relief Commission recently appointed by the Government of Canada, T. S. Rogers, Chairman, Judge W. B. Wallace and F. W. Fowke, appeared before the Board of Control asking for the sympathy, consideration and support of the Mayor, the Controllers and the Aldermen of the City of Halifax, and requested that the City appoint an Advisory Committee to assist them in the various matters which will be constantly arising, and with which the members of the City Council will naturally have more intimate knowledge at first hand than the members of the Commission. The Commission recommended that such Commission Committee consist of His Worship the Mayor, two Controllers and one Alderman for Ward VI, and one other Alderman.

The Board of Control recommend that the request of the Commission be complied with and that the Advisory Committee consist of His Worship the Mayor, Controllers Hines and Murphy, and Aldermen Godwin and Guildford.

It is further recommended that the thanks of the City Council be tendered the Relief Commission for the suggestion for the appointment of such Committee.
