Aldermen H. S. Colwell and R. B. Colwell suggested that this item be referred back to the Board of Control to consider the advisability of increasing the salaries of the staff \$100.00 each instead of \$50.00 each, as recommended.

City Health Board, \$16072.00.

It is suggested by Aldermen Kelly and Foley that the Board take into further consideration the salaries of the Assistant Secretary and the Inspectors, with the idea of increasing them.

Alderman R. B. Colwell asked for a detailed report of the income of J. F. Dempster, Superintendent of the Infectious Diseases Hospital, from all sources.

Alderman H. S. Cohwell recommended that the Board of Health abandon the system of "farming out" the feeding of patients in the Infectious Diseases Hospital. Superannuations, \$5008.73. Approved. Provincial Exhibition, \$1953.51.

PROVINCIAL EXHIBITION.

Alderman R. B. Colwell asked that the Relief Advisory Committee take up with the Relief Commission the suggestion that the Relief Commission pay a rental to the Exhibition Commission for the use of the property used by them for Temporary Housing, in order that the Exhibition may recover through such rental sufficient revenue to pay fixed overhead expenses lost through the non-holding of the Exhibition during 1916 because of the total destruction of the property by the explosion.

Sewer Frontage Rates. Peddlers' License Penalties. Water Meters. Neglected Colored Children. Gratuities to Widows of Firemen. Superannaution of City Home Officials. Fire Escapes. Expropriation of Property. Gerrish Street Engine House. Sewers in Streets not taken over by City. Limit of Assessment for General Purposes. Expropriation Arbitrators. Amount to be borrowed and included in Estimates.

The clause relating to water meters is referred back to the Board of Control with the recommendation that the definition of "occupant" be amended.

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Alderman H. S. Colwell asked that application be made to the Relief Commission to pay the gratuities to

the widows of firemen killed in the explosion.

OILING OF STREETS.

Alderman Kelly asked that the Board of Control

consider the amending of the law relating to the oiling of streets so that the abutting owners would not have to pay the whole cost.

POLICE APPRINTMENTS.

Alderman Kelly asked that Legislation be sought restoring to the City Council the authority to appoint and dismiss policemen.



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
