And Whereas a cruel unwarranted attack was made in the columns of the Evening Mail and Halifax Herald in the issues of January 9 and 10, on the Civic Officials and elected representatives of theft of liquor and other ungentlemanly conduct and the same have gone broadcast over the whole Continent to be published in other newspapers and

Whereas the Mayor of Halifax City at an investigation held at the City Hall on with witnesses under oath has reported that the investigation has proven that the accusations were groundless and such a state of affairs as the Evening Mail pictured did not exist and that the charges are a slander on the good name of the City and its officials and elected representatives,

Therefore Resolved that we as a City Council hereby protest against the unfair statement made by the Evening Mail and call on the management of the Herald Co., Ltd., to publish a complete denial of the charges made and that the same be given the same publicity as the aforesaid charge, within 48 hours of the receipt of this resolution, failing to do so will render them liable to a charge in the Courts for slander.
