Halifax 25th July, 1918.

Sir:

I am directed by the Provincial Secretary to inform you that the Board of School Commissioners for the City of Halifax has applied to the Governor in Council under Section 901 of the Halifax City Charter for an Order directing the City to issue its Debentures or Stock to the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars, the same being required for the purpose of effecting permanent repairs to certain school buildings damaged by the explosion in order to restore them to normal condition; and for its issue of Debentures or Stock to the amount of One Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand Dollars, the same being required for repairs to the following named schools - Bloomfield High School, Chebucto, Joseph Howe, Oxford and St. Patrick's Girls High School; and for its issue of Debentures or Stock for Thirteen Hundred and Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents for the purchase of two portable school buildings for the extra accommodation of children in the devastated area.

I am also to inform you that the Governor in Council has appointed Saturday, the 27th inst., at eleven o'clock A.M. in the Executive Council Room, Province Building, City of Halifax, as the time and place at which the matter of such application shall be heard, and that



the City may appear at the hearing.
