November 27th, 1919

to inform you that the Board of School Commissioners for the City of Halifax has applied to the Governor in Council for an order under section 901 of the City Charter, directing the City to issue its debentures or stock to provide money for erecting certain school buildings as set forth in the following resolution of the Board passed the 29th day of September , A. D. 1919:-

RESOLVED that application be made to the Governor in Council for an order directing the City Council to issue debentures to the amount of Nine Hundred and Seventy Two Thousand, Four Hundred and Twenty Nine 50/100 (\$972,924.50) Dollars, to pay for the erection

of four schools, as follows :-
