# Site rules

The designated outdoor sheltering locations, shown on the map below, are for those experiencing homelessness. Individuals sheltering at these locations must comply with the following rules:

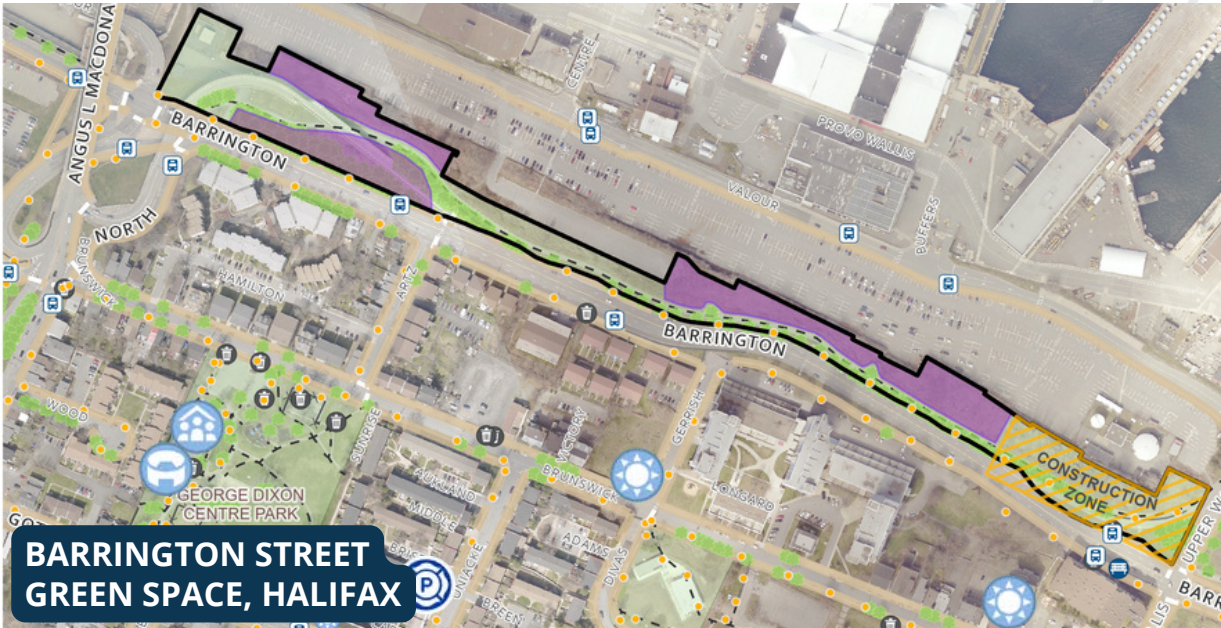
- Maximum 4 tents per site (first come, first served)
- Tents must be spaced 3 metres / 9 feet apart
- Tents may not be larger than 9 square metres / 81 square feet (approx. 3 metres X 3 metres / 9 feet X 9 feet)
- No open fires
- Camp at your own risk

There are **four designated outdoor sheltering locations** in the municipality

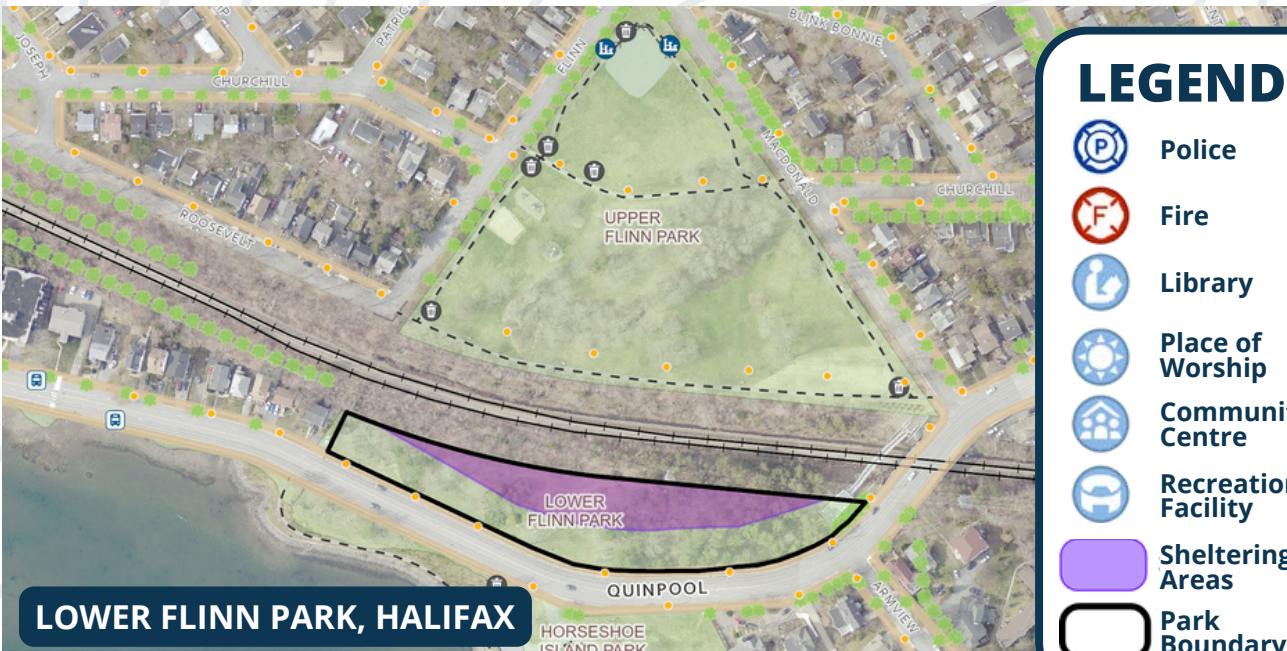
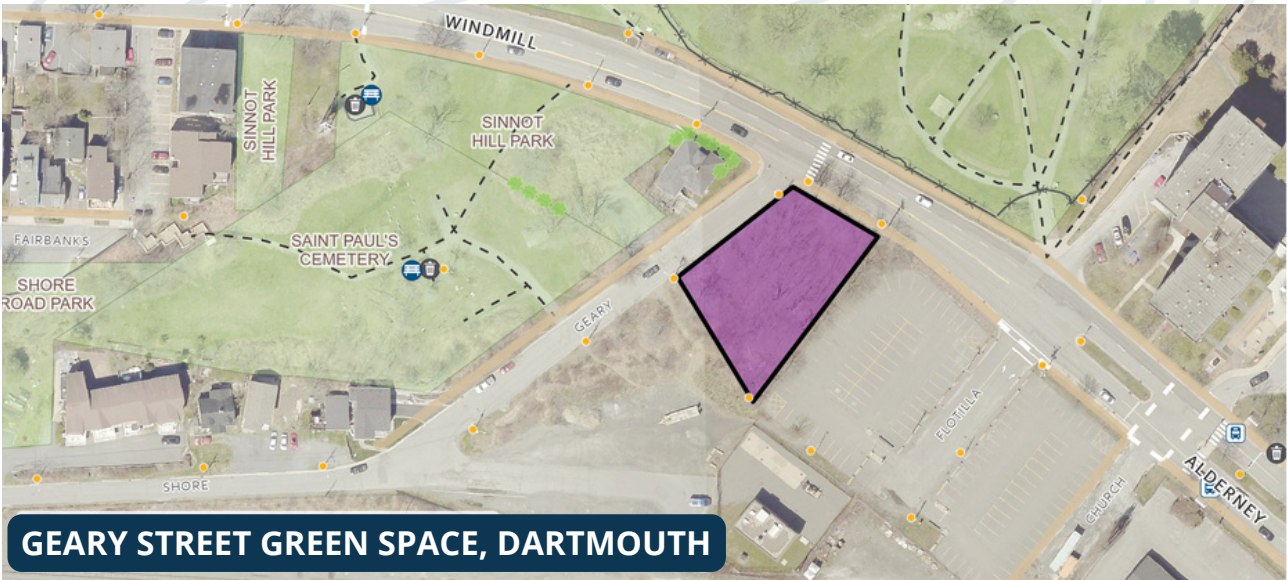
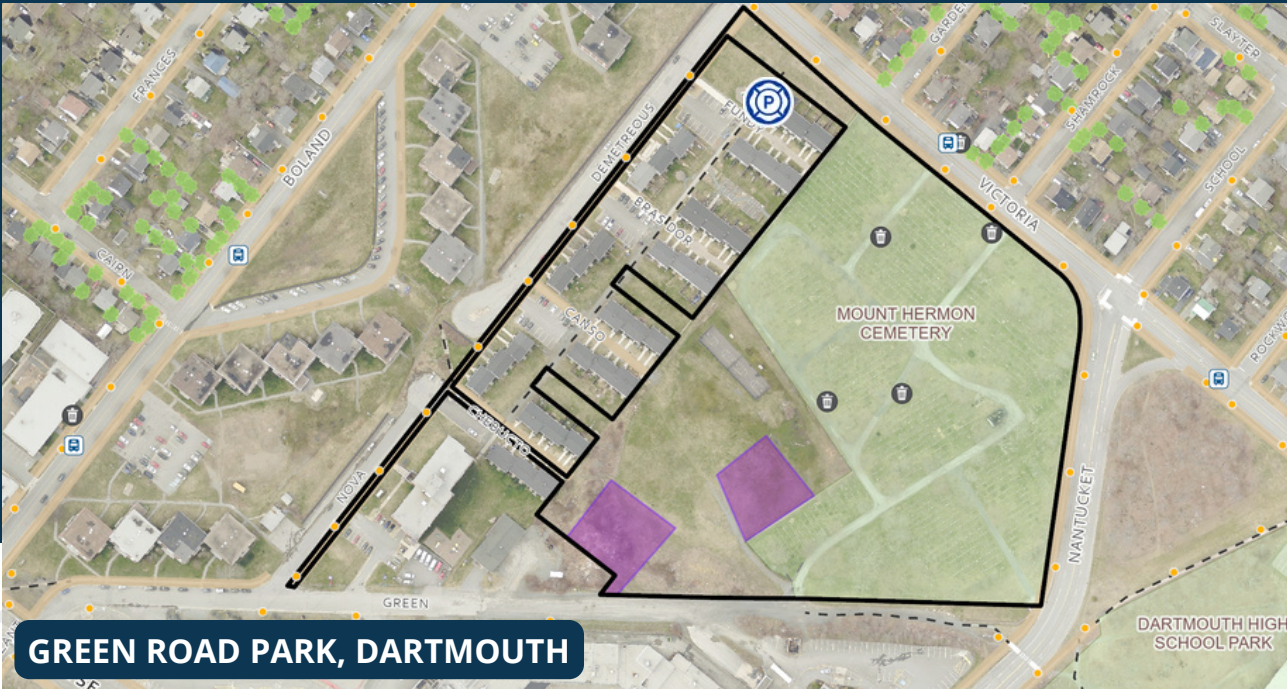


**Sheltering is permitted in specific areas, within each designated location.**
