Each year the Mayor and Halifax Regional Council recognize the extraordinary contributions of outstanding individuals and groups who volunteer their time and skills in our communities.

Thank you for taking the time to nominate an outstanding organization. One group will be selected to receive an award from each of the three categories. Please read the following criteria carefully before filling out your nomination.

### NOMINATION CRITERIA

- The award is open for any volunteer group (a club, society or association that is organized and operated without the purpose of making a profit) that has made a significant impact on building stronger communities through service, programs, projects and/or events and delivers these in the municipality.
- This is a scored process—all areas of the nomination form must be completed and well explained. Nominations which are incomplete, inaccurate, late or do not comply with the below criteria may not be accepted.
- Groups who meet the following criteria are eligible for an award:
  - Demonstrates initiative, leadership and creativity in service to others;
  - has a broad impact on the community;
  - $\circ\$  shows successful partnerships or collaborations; and
  - improves the overall quality of life of citizens.
- It is important to illustrate the impact the group has had and capture as much of the group's history as possible.
- The group's volunteer efforts listed on this form must be voluntary and not part of day-to-day employment functions.
- Volunteer groups that are nominated are eligible for an award in one of three categories (please select the appropriate category on the following form):
  - Category 1: Community group with an annual budget under \$50,000
  - Category 2: Community group with an annual budget of over \$50,000
  - Category 3: Youth group (volunteers up to 25 years old)

### AWARD SELECTION PROCESS

- All nominations are scored.
- All nominees and award recipients are presented to the Executive Standing Committee of Council and to Regional Council for final approval.
- Groups selected to receive an award from each category will be notified in March. Two representatives from each group may attend the awards ceremony to receive their award.
- All nominators will receive a letter in March informing them of the status of their nominee.
