Some projects being readied for 2021 construction:

- Wyse Road protected bike lanes;
- Allan and Vernon Seymour enhancements;
- Phase one of North End Local Street Bikeway
 - Dahlia Local Street Bikeway
- Bayers Road MUP, next phase
- Terminal Road protected bike lanes
- Tactical urbanism improvements



Winter works standards for AT facilities

- Passed at Regional Council, September 29, 2020. Link: https://www.halifax.ca/sites/default/files/documents/city-hall/regional-council/200929rc1118.pdf
- Appendix C has standards and detail.
- Changes:
 - multi-use pathways, local street bikeways and protected bike lanes now have service standards. Depends on location and adjacency to priority one streets.
 - For the most part, facilities will be priority one cleared 12 hours after end of event.
 - Added attention to pedestrian call buttons, tactile warning strips, pedestrian ramps and accessible parking spaces
 - Faster clearing of bus stops, pending budget increase.

New Active Transportation(and recreational trails) grants program

- Approved by Council Sept. 29, 2020
- Supports community associations who build and maintain AT facilities.
- Replaces support to HRTAmember associations.
- New AT Promotion and Education grant program.





Monitoring

- Permanent bike counters on Hollis and South Park. Others being added on Vernon-Seymour, Dartmouth Harbourfront and Windsor Street.
- Fall monitoring underway now (e.g. Vernon and side street volume and speeds, Allan volume and speeds, North End Local Street Bikeway, others). 24 hour counts.
- Modified peninsula screenline
- Counts by community associations





Education and Promotion activities

- Get There by Bike Community grants
- Web information and PSAs on new facilities
- Making Tracks Bike Safety Videos (EAC project)
- Online interactive bike map
