- 9.1.1 Development of Senior Safety Strategy at HRM

The following was before the Committee:

Staff presentation dated May 1, 2025

Frances Tufford, Research & Development Specialist, Public Safety gave a presentation, seeking feedback on the Strategy and responded to questions of clarification from the Committee.

The Committee noted the following:

- Consultation with isolated seniors;
- Engagement with service providers (e.g. Mi'kmaw Native Friendship Centre and Welta'sualule'k Kiknu);
- Reframe sociodemographic factors based on life experience;
- Need for robust infrastructure (e.g. mobility, safe place to live, access to healthy food);
- Digital literacy for newcomers as language can be an increased barrier for detecting fraud;

- Concern with seniors being targeted for fraud;
- Need for intragenerational support and utilizing and engaging newer and older seniors' perspectives and life experiences;
- Include a link or information on the Seniors' Home Safety Program on Halifax.ca for seniors interested in volunteering with the program; and
- Include information on seniors experiencing homelessness.

## 9.2 COMMITTEE MEMBERS 9.2.1 Discussion of Work Plan

The following was before the Committee:

• Approved Revised Women and Gender Equity Advisory Committee 2024 Work Plan

The Committee discussed Priority 3: *Housing and food security for women in HRM*, identified as a top priority for 2025, and noted the following topics they would like included in their 2025 work plan:

- Apply a broad Indigenous lens, treaty rights lens, and perspectives of Indigenous youth and elders:
- Optimizing HRM-maintained community gardens; spaces often lacked signage or identification of plants, making them an underutilized public infrastructure;
- Receive presentations on existing programs for review and optimization; and
- Invite staff to discuss needs assessed for Affordable Housing Programs for follow up or further planning, with desired outcomes to include housing needs for 2SLGBTQ+.

Tracey Jones-Grant, Managing Director, Diversity & Inclusion, Amy Brierley, Social Policy Strategist, Community Safety and Krista Vining, Team Lead, Legislative Assistants responded to questions of clarification from the Committee.
