RoadWorks Online Map

[RoadWorks](#) is an online map that provides residents an easy way to learn about planned street & sidewalk disruptions in their community and on their commute.

Current planned street and sidewalk disruptions and those beginning in the next seven (7) days are posted on the RoadWorks map. The map is updated every 24 hours. Users can find

descriptions of the closures, including start and end dates.

Users can zoom in and out in the map to view more or fewer closures, marked with different colors and shapes depending on the closure type. Residents can also view disruptions by entering a civic address or by looking at the list of disruptions within the map.

Halifax Bike App

HRM has launched a new Halifax Bike Map app

Feedback from residents showed a strong desire for a more user-friendly tool for bicycle route planning, similar to what is offered in many other Canadian cities.

The new app will allow users to see the following:

- Existing cycling infrastructure
- Suggested cycling routes where dedicated infrastructure does not currently exist

- Bike lockers
- Other features including schools, libraries, transit terminals, recreation centres and public washrooms

Users will also be able to search for specific routes and pan and zoom around the map to locate routes near their neighbourhood and click for more information.

Printed copies of the Halifax Bike Map, updated annually, will remain available at municipal recreation centres and other bike-friendly businesses throughout the region. Residents can also call 311 to request a printed map.
