Both sites of Fairview Heights Elementary will see new play structures. Pending results of their Provincial funding application, the sports court will be updated with basketball standards and they will have some goal posts installed in the small field in front of the main building.

HEART SHAPED POND STUDY, HEMLOCK RAVINE PARK

The Heart-Shaped Pond is located within Hemlock Ravine Park. The unique site has historical significance, as it was first constructed by Prince Edward, Duke of Kent. Over time the pond has acquired ecological value, notably as habitat for the yellow-spotted salamander, green frogs and a variety of aquatic plants and insects.

HRM has engaged the consulting firm WSP Canada to prepare and submit a comprehensive report detailing the current status and proposed management recommendations for the Heart-Shaped Pond.

The consultant's report will complete the following objectives:

- Aquatic ecological inventory and assessment;
- Pond hydrological assessment;
- Water quality assessment;
- Pond wall and coping structural assessment;
- Detailed maintenance and management recommendations;
- Evaluation of pond heritage values, and aesthetic considerations;
- Timeline for proposed works;
- Cost estimation for proposed works.



DISTRICT IMPROVEMENTS Improvements underway or planned in

our area for 2014 include:

- Sidewalk Renewal on Bedford Highway from Ramp DV-B to Main
- Dunbrack Street Rockfalls rockfall upgrades from Kearney Lake to Wentworth
- Sidewalk Renewal on Flamingo Drive from Canary to Meadowlark
- Street Resurfacing on Lacewood Drive from Dunbrack to Cedarbrae
- Curb Renewal on Main Avenue from Titus to Bedford Highway
- Street Paving on Main Avenue from Titus to Berts
- Sidewalk Renewal on Main Avenue from Titus to Berts
- Sidewalk Renewal on Main Avenue from Ford to Bedford Highway
- Street Pavement Patching on Main Avenue from Titus to Bedford Highway
- Curb Renewal on Sunnybrae from Hillcrest to Gesner
- Street Paving on Sunnybrae from Hillcrest to Gesner
- Street Paving on Titus Street from Main to Evans
- Sidewalk Renewal on Titus Street from Evans to Main
- Street Resurfacing on Willett Street from Lacewood to Dunbrack
- Street Paving on Willett Street from Main to Melrose

LACEWOOD TRANSIT TERMINAL The Lacewood Transit Terminal site has been cleared and leveled.

Pipes for underground services are currently being installed on site. The tender for the design and construction of the terminal was issued on May 13, 2014, and closed on June 12, 2014. It is expected that construction will take approximately eight to ten months.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: HALIFAX NORTH WEST TRAILS ASSOCIATION (submitted by Bob McDonald)

Halifax North West Trails Association has an active presence in the Mainland North Area. As one of the 20 volunteer trail groups in HRM, we keep busy planning, building and maintaining trails, as well as hosting guided trail walks. Many of the trails have been built by developers as a portion of their parkland contribution over the years. All the trails are on HRM land so they belong to all of us. Local input at public hearings hosted by HRM Planning has helped to increase the number of new trails in recent years in the many neighbourhoods nearby. Perhaps the most popular is the Mainland North Linear Parkway or "The Power Line Trail" to most of us! Now nearly 5 kms long, it extends from the edge of Mount Royale Subdivision at the top of Fairview all the way to Kearney Lake Road. We know that over 10,000 residents are using this trail each month during the fair weather months. Count yourself in! The long term goal is to link this trail to the Chain of Lakes Trail across Highway 102 for a key Active Transportation route someday.

The Linear Trail also allows connections in to the Mainland Common and by way of the wooded looped trail through Mary Clayton Memorial Park on the way to the Library or Halifax West High School. Check out the large map of the Common at the top of Westridge Drive and at the Canada Games Centre to help find your way or pick up a trails brochure from the Library shelves.
