

#### **HRM Launches Open Data Catalogue**

On April 10<sup>th</sup>, accessing popular city information became easier when HRM launched its open data catalogue, as part of a pilot project to release readily available, high quality data sets for public viewing, and use in the development of web and mobile based applications.

The launch of this free, online data catalogue represents the first step in an ongoing effort by members of Council to make city government more open and accessible to residents.

Seventeen data sets will be released during this phase of the pilot project including information on HRM parks, buildings, garbage and recycling collection zones, civic addresses, and transit routes and schedules. These data sets were selected because they were complete and accurate, with good data management practices already in place, were free of personal and confidential information, and had been previously requested by HRM citizens.

HRM will be looking for feedback on additional data sets citizens would like to see released in subsequent phases of the project and is excited to engage citizens, developers, academia and industry in the development of innovative and creative applications using the initial data sets during our upcoming open data contest.

HRM's open data contest will run from July to November. Nova Scotia residents, application developers and post-secondary students will be encouraged to submit applications, or ideas for applications, using one or more of HRM's free data sets. More details on the contest will be available over the next few months in advance of the contest launch in July. Page 2

Following an evaluation of the initial data release and results of the application contest, HRM staff will bring forward a report to Regional Council with recommendations on how to move forward on expanding HRM's open data program.

## Halifax Public Gardens Reopens

Halifax Public Gardens will open its gates for regular operating hours, 8 a.m. to dusk each day, starting Monday, April 15.

Visitors to the Gardens are encouraged to enjoy the space on a lunch hour, stroll through the park area for exercise, or enjoy the free open-air concerts on Sundays during the summer. Uncommon Grounds coffee shop in Horticultural Hall will also be open for business on April 16.

In an effort to preserve the Gardens for future generations, HRM asks that visitors please respect the "no pets, no biking, no jogging" guideline. Visitors are also reminded not to feed the ducks because this can make them dependent on an unnatural food supply and interfere with their natural migratory patterns in the fall and spring.

One of the finest surviving examples of Victorian Gardens in North America, the Halifax Public Gardens began on Common land by the Nova Scotia Horticultural Society in 1836. The Gardens was recognized as a National Historic Site in 1984.
