Construction Mitigation Guidelines Feedback

The Halifax Regional Municipality is inviting residents and property owners to provide feedback on new Construction Mitigation Guidelines.

Construction in the downtown core and other commercial areas is a welcome sign of economic development and vitality yet can also result in dust, noise, reduced parking, and mobility challenges. Current municipal construction protocols do not adequately address these effects, which could largely be mitigated by improved fencing and signage, maintaining better sidewalks and minimizing dirt and debris on the street.

After years of research and public consultation, the municipality is preparing to tear down the Cogswell Interchange in Halifax and

redevelop the site. Redevelopment will better connect our communities, break down barriers and release six acres of land for development.

Now that Regional Council has approved the Cogswell Lands Plan, it will go ahead as presented; however, there will be further opportunities for public engagement later this year on other aspects of the project, including new open spaces, planning regulations and the design review. Right now we're focused on the planning and design work; construction will start in the fall of 2017 and continue for about three years. To learn more about the project, check out our website.
