

Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency imposes ban on open-air burning

Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency is advising residents that an open-air burning ban is now in effect for the entire municipality.

This ban is being triggered by the extremely dry conditions our fire officials are seeing across the region. Residents cannot burn at any time anywhere in the municipality until further notice. This ban also prohibits the use of outdoor fireplaces, including chimeneas.

It should be noted this municipal ban is being executed by Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency and takes priority over any restrictions currently imposed by the provincial Department of Natural Resources.

In the majority of cases, Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency will mirror the level of restriction on open-air burning declared by the province. While the municipality can never assert a level of restriction lower than what the province has declared, the fire service has the ability to be **more** restrictive than the province if it's warranted. In this case Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency feels a more restrictive level is warranted for outdoor burning in the municipality.

Residents **are** permitted to use natural gas or propane fire pits when a burn ban is in place. The public will be notified when this municipal open-air burning ban is lifted.

Hemlock Ravine Park Construction and Parking Restrictions

Construction continues until approximately September 13, at the park to carry out some required maintenance on the heart-shaped pond. Contractors will be replacing the wall surrounding the pond, improving drainage, and removing organic debris from the bottom of the pond to improve clarity and overall water quality. Work is anticipated to take place each day from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.

The construction firm will be taking up most of the parking lot while work is underway, significantly reducing public parking access. Access to on-street parking and walking paths will be maintained throughout

the project, however there may be periodic interruptions and re-routing of park-goers while construction takes place.
