

Municipality Takes Over Ownership, **Maintenance of Street Lights**

The Halifax Regional Municipality is advising residents that if they have a concern with a street light in their community, they should now report it online at www.halifax.ca.

On Aug. 1, 2014, the municipality took over ownership and responsibility for street lights, including those in municipal parks and open spaces. Nova Scotia Power is no longer responsible for the maintenance of street lights in any area of the Halifax region. The only exceptions continue to be street lights on the 100-series highways, on- and offramps for the highways and the Circumferential Highway (Highway 111) between the MacKay Bridge and Pleasant Street. These street lights are owned by the province and should be reported to the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal by calling 902-424-5080.

There are almost 43,000 street lights in the Halifax region, 28,000 of which were previously owned and maintained by Nova Scotia Power. Consolidating ownership under the municipality will save money and provide more consistent service levels across all municipal districts. Over the next five years the municipality will convert all street lights to LED August 13, 2014

technology. This will save more than \$3 million a year in operating costs by reducing energy consumption and maintenance costs.

Residents that notice a street light on during the day, burnt-out, flashing or flickering lights, damaged street lights or exposed wires can go to https://apps.halifax.ca/311 to file a report online. Simply select "Streets & Roads" under the dropdown category menu, click on the "Street Lighting Concerns" link and fill out the appropriate information fields. Residents also have the option of calling 311. Information to prevent you from becoming a victim of Scamming

The Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA) set rules for the collection, use and disclosure of personal information that organizations and businesses must follow in the course of commercial activities. PIPEDA requires that companies obtain people's consent before collecting, using or disclosing their personal information. Get Ready for Ten-Digit Local Dialing

Ten-digit dialing is coming to our region. The requirement to adopt 10-digit dialing for all local calls within the 902 area code will be implemented on August 23rd, 2014. Residential customers who do

not dial 10 digits will hear a reminder to do so before the call is completed.

Starting in November 2014, the new 782 area code will be available in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.
