Halifax Transit has released its much anticipated draft *Moving Forward Together Plan* and is asking residents to provide feedback. The plan proposes a redesign of the transit network to make it simpler, smarter and more efficient.

The comprehensive system review and network redesign came out of a series of public consultations that took place over several months in 2013 and gathered the input of community groups, Regional Council and thousands of residents.

The focus of the plan is to make it easier for Halifax Transit users to get where they're going by:

- investing in the most popular routes;
- offering faster commutes during rush hour;
- making transfers easier to use;

## New Service Available to Seniors: 211 Nova Scotia

Since January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015, seniors only need to dial three digits to get information they need as the province-wide 211 service will handle inquiries about senior abuse and provincial programs.

Calls to 211 are toll-free from any phone in Nova Scotia, and 211 also offers an easy-to-navigate online database at <a href="https://www.ns.211.ca">www.ns.211.ca</a>.

211 Nova Scotia is a confidential information and referral service for community, non-profit and government services. It has information about thousands of services, is available 24 hours a day and has interpretation services for more than 100 languages.

## **Heating Assistance Rebate Program 2014-2015**

The Heating Assistance Rebate Program (HARP) provides help to lower-income Nova Scotians with the cost of home heating. You qualify for this program if you pay a heating bill at your current address and meet ONE of the following criteria:

- live alone with an income of \$27,000 or less
- live with others and have a combined income of \$42,000 or less
- receive Income Assistance from the Department of Community Services
- receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement from Service Canada

Your application must be mailed by March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2015.

## Canada Post Ceases Door to Door Delivery

This spring Canada Post will cease door to door delivery. Home delivery will be replaced by community mailboxes. Despite the fact that the majority of the locations are in the HRM right-of-way, under the Canada Post Act they have a right to place the community mail boxes where they wish to locate them and Council cannot refuse them. If there are specific safety concerns, you can ask them to review a proposed location. Canada Post is responsible for year round maintenance, including graffiti, garbage and snow removal so the mail boxes can be accessed safely and are not unsightly. If you have any concerns about the location, access, or maintenance of the mail boxes, please contact Canada Post at 1-844-454-3009.
