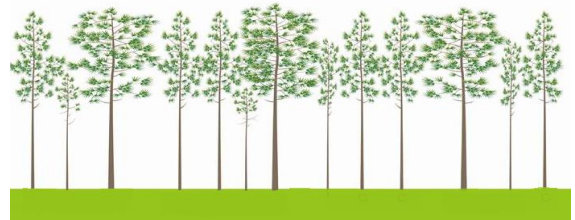
Urban Forest comes to Fairview

Fairview will be getting 200 new street trees this month as part of the Urban Forest Master Plan.

The goal of the Urban Forest Master Plan is to ensure a sustainable future for our urban forest and to create awareness about the many benefits we all gain from the trees in our neighbourhoods.

Trees will be planted along sections of Alex Street, Coronation Avenue, Hillcrest Street, Melrose Avenue, and Sunnybrae Avenue. In years to come these trees will beautify the neighbourhood and grow to form a protective canopy cover.

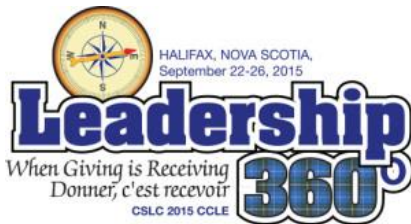
Free Swimming Lessons
