Camp Courage Application Deadline Approaching

The deadline is fast approaching for teen girls aged 15-19 to apply for acceptance into this summer's first-responder mentoring camp, Camp Courage. Camp Courage is an eight-day all-girls camp that brings females curious about a career as a first-

responder together with professionals from the world of firefighting, paramedicine, and policing. The camp is held every second year and shows impressionable teens that they too can excel in these male-dominated professions. While the camp shows girls what it takes to have a career as a first-responder, the ultimate goal is for the young women to leave with a sense of empowerment and the confidence to believe they can achieve any goal, career, or dream they desire.

Interested girls have until March 31st at 6 p.m. to submit an application. Registration for the camp is free, but there's a catch: Applicants are required to write an essay describing what they would do to better their community and improve someone's life. In the eight years since this unique camp started, more than 30 young women have embarked on careers as a first-responder – some of the women were trailblazers in their community. Halifax Transit Increases Alderney Ferry

Halifax Transit is advising that there will be increased ferry crossings to accommodate the Macdonald Bridge re-decking project.

Halifax Harbour Bridges has initiated its nightly closure of the Macdonald Bridge and will continue to do so from Sundays to Thursdays between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. It is important to note peak weekday commuting travel will not be affected by the 'Big Lift' project.

Halifax Transit has increased service on the Alderney to Halifax ferry route as a way to help ease the inconvenience caused by the bridge work. Weekday service will expand to include 15-minute departures after 6 p.m. until 11:45 p.m., and Sunday service will now begin at 6:30 a.m. on a 30 minute frequency until 11:45 p.m.

Shuttle bus service will also be provided in place of routes that normally travel across the Macdonald Bridge. Passengers travelling to Dartmouth will disembark at the Scotia Square Terminal and board a shuttle at the MetroLink bus stop. The shuttle will also service stops along Gottingen Street as far as North Street. Passengers will cross the MacKay Bridge, disembarking at the Highfield Terminal or Bridge Terminal in Dartmouth.

The Heating Assistance Rebate Program (HARP) provides help to lower-income Nova Scotians with the cost of home heating. You qualify for this program if you pay a heating bill at your current address and meet ONE of the following criteria:

- live alone with an income of \$27,000 or less
- live with others and have a combined income of \$42,000 or less
- receive Income Assistance from the Department of Community Services
- receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement from Service Canada
