Open Air Burning Bans

During Wildfire Risk Season, brush burning and camp fires are not permitted from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. The Department of Natural Resources update a map on its website every day at 2 p.m. during the burning season to indicate the various levels of restriction depending on where you are in the province.

The onus rests with the public to check the website and determine if a ban is in place for their particular region.

Halifax Regional Fire and Emergency do have the ability to be more restrictive than the province if they feel it's warranted. Stay tuned to information on the <u>Fire website</u> and the <u>Fire Twitter feed</u> for details on burning restrictions.

Spring Road Maintenance

With the hot asphalt plant now operational for the season and the arrival of warmer temperatures, repair efforts are in full swing for potholes, cracking and bulking in our streets.

Potholes are identified during regular staff road patrols, as well as reports from residents. The first priority is to address potholes on main arterial routes, in addition to monitoring residential side streets across the region to identify and address problem areas.

To report a pothole, residents can submit an <u>online</u> <u>service request</u> or call 311.

The municipality will also be working to repaint pavement markings in the downtown core and continue in other areas of the region into the fall. The majority of painting on busy streets is performed during the overnight hours to minimize traffic disruption.

2015-2016 Operating Budget

Halifax Regional Council has approved our 2015-2016 Operating and Projects Budget.

The budgets include a residential tax rate increase of 1.1 cents, while the urban commercial tax rate drops by 4.4 cents and both transit tax rates decrease.

The residential tax rate increase will enable new programs, services and infrastructure including construction of the second North Park roundabout, a permanent pavilion building at the Emera Oval, continued implementation of the five-year \$43 million investment in transit technology upgrades, investments in rural fire services and much more.

- Remove leftover items from the curb by dusk on Sunday; treasures not removed can result in a By-Law violation;
- This event happens RAIN or SHINE. Please use your discretion when deciding whether or not to put items out to the curb.

Congratulations to all the participants in this weekend's Scotiabank Bluenose Marathon! The Bluenose events will be happening on Saturday May 16th and Sunday May 17th and bring out thousands of participants and spectators so whether you're running, cheering or simply travelling through the downtown area this weekend – please be aware of the following street closures:

- Brunswick Street between Duke Street and Sackville Street, as well as all side streets feeding into the closed section, closed 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and 5 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday;
- Sackville Street between Brunswick Street and South Park Street, closed 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday and 5 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Sunday;
- Cogswell Street between Gottingen Street and Brunswick Street, closed 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday and 9 a.m. to noon on Sunday;
- Nantucket Avenue between Wyse Road and Victoria Road, closed 6 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Sunday;
- Southbound curb lane on Barrington Street between Devonshire Avenue and North Street, closed 8:30 a.m. to noon on Sunday.
- The Macdonald Bridge will be closed to vehicles from 6:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. on Sunday for the longer distance events.

<u>Halifax Transit</u> is pleased to offer free conventional bus and ferry service for volunteers (Friday – Sunday) and race participants (Saturday – Sunday). There will also be a <u>bike valet service</u> in Grand Parade and reduced parking fees at many <u>Impark parking</u> lots.

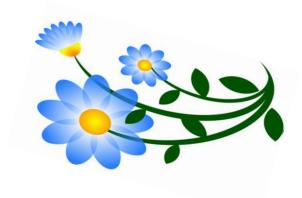
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
