The municipality's current composting facilities are, without significant investment, nearing the end of their useful lives. The facilities have also reached their

processing capacity and new provincial composting maturity guidelines have been established. With additional investment required to manage organics, the municipality wishes to engage residents and hear their thoughts on which attributes are important when considering future compost systems and operations. Public input will help guide staff in the formation of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and a Request for Proposals (RFP). The goal is to have the new strategy operational by 2019/20.

Change Your Clocks

Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency (HRFE) wishes to remind you to 'fall back' this Saturday night before you go to bed. When you turn back your clocks by an hour you should also change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. While you're at it, check the expiry on the back of the smoke detector. The National

Fire Protection Association says smoke detectors should be replaced every 10 years. HRFE investigators frequently discover smoke alarms didn't sound when they followed up on fire fatalities. Usually it's either because the alarm has been disconnected or batteries were dead or taken out to be used for something else, and not replaced.

HRFE has a public education program called, 'Alarmed and Ready'. The purpose of the program is to provide a smoke alarm, free of charge, for those in need. To place a request for a free smoke alarm call: 902-490-5590. This program also gives our front-line firefighters an opportunity to educate the public on the importance of an early warning device in the home, and to demonstrate to residents how to maintain and test their smoke alarms.

Municipality to Review Stormwater Right-of-Way Charge

Regional Council has directed municipal staff to explore options to address storm water right-of-way charges moving forward including, but not limited to, charges being placed against condominium parking and storage spaces.

The stormwater right-of-way charge is a cost-recovery mechanism to help fund the municipality's share of the repair and maintenance of the stormwater systems that control water runoff from municipal roads.

In 2013, the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board required Halifax Water to charge approximately 40 percent of its Stormwater Services costs to the municipality to cover stormwater flows from public roadways. For the past two years, this was collected through the Halifax Water bill. In June 2015, Regional Council decided to collect the charge through the property tax bill and, for 2016-17, directed that a stormwater right-of-way charge be set at \$42 per property for those properties within the Halifax Water Stormwater Service Area.

The stormwater right-of-way charge on the municipal tax bill applies to all taxable accounts, regardless of property value, size, or type. As a result, those who own a condo unit, as well as a separately deeded parking space and/or storage locker, are being charged for each separate assessment account. This affects approximately eight percent of condo owners, equating to approximately 900 accounts.

Regional Council has committed to revisiting this matter promptly and has directed staff to explore the feasibility of several options, which includes consideration of reimbursement for residents with condo parking and storage spaces. A staff recommendation report is anticipated to come before Regional Council for deliberation in November.

In the meantime, residents are reminded they are required to pay their entire tax bill in a timely manner. It will be important for those with concerns about multiple charges associated with the stormwater right-of-way charge to pay the charges so that proper arrangements can be made to address these payments, pending Regional Council's direction.

Heating Assistance Rebate Program

Apply between October 31, 2016 and March 31, 2017.

The Heating Assistance Rebate Program (HARP) helps with the cost of home heating for low-income Nova Scotians who pay for their own heat. Rebates range from \$100 to \$200. You can apply between October 31, 2016 and March 31, 2017. To qualify for the rebate, you must pay for your own heat and meet 1 of the following criteria:

- a net income of \$27,000 or less and live alone with no kids or dependents
- have a combined net income of \$42,000 or less and live with kids, dependents, or other adults
- receive income assistance from the Department of Community Services
- receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement or the Allowance from Service Canada

If your personal or financial situation has changed since last year, you still may qualify. Examples of changes include becoming widowed, getting divorced or legally separated, losing your job, or having the custody of your children change.
