

# **UFMP Takes Root: Fairview's Fall Tree Planting Program**

On Tuesday, Sept. 25, 2012, Halifax Regional Council approved HRM's urban forest master plan (UFMP). HRM's urban forest consists of all trees within the urban core, including street trees, park trees, and trees on private and public land. The goal of the plan is to ensure a sustainable future for our urban forest and to create awareness about environmental stewardship.



This spring one hundred and fifty-one new street trees were planted in the Fairview urban forest neighbourhood.

Within a few weeks the fall planting season will begin. Fifty-four new street trees will be planted along Rosedale Avenue. In the W.D. Piercey Sports Field twenty trees will be planted to provide shade for players and spectators. In years to come these trees will beautify the neighbourhood and grow tall to form a protective canopy cover. Fall planting starts in mid-October and will continue until the end of November.

**Solid Waste Resources Strategy** 

As part of Halifax Regional Municipality's community engagement program for the Solid Waste Resources Strategy Review, regional public event sessions will run from September 25<sup>th</sup> to October 24<sup>th</sup>. HRM staff is asking for public input to assist Regional Council in making an informed decision about how to improve the solid waste system. The community engagement process is designed to help residents gain a clear understanding of the information available and what is at stake so they can provide feedback on

what's working, what isn't, and how HRM can deliver the best system possible for many years to come.

The regional public event sessions are designed to both inform and engage. Attendees will learn and share their thoughts (in-person and online via <a href="https://www.shapeyourcityhalifax.ca">www.shapeyourcityhalifax.ca</a>) on HRM's solid waste system, options recommended by consultants, and the potential implications of introducing or not introducing those options.

The first phase of community engagement sessions is complete. The first round focused on identifying the public's key priorities for making changes to the current solid waste system, while the second round will collect specific public feedback on the options being assessed within the strategy review.



At the end of the consultation process a report detailing the feedback of residents will be shared with Regional Council to inform its decisions regarding the future of the solid waste system.

ensures the contents are transported to the correct processing facility. There is a 20 bag limit for curb side collection with a maximum weight limit of 25 kg (55 lb) per bag.

In accordance with HRM Streets By-Law S-300, Section 43, residents shall not sweep or deposit leaves in the gutter or roadway. The potential for street flooding is greatly increased when catch basins are clogged with leaves.
