# **LED Streetlight Conversion Project**

The LED Streetlight Conversion Project began on October 5<sup>th</sup>. To help make our communities safer and more energy efficient, the Halifax Regional Municipality is moving forward with a project to replace all traditional high-pressure sodium streetlights in the Halifax region with energy efficient LED technology.

The municipality is responsible for more than 44,000 streetlights across the region. About 7,000 of those have already been converted to LED technology through spot replacements and smaller conversion projects. All the remaining streetlights will be converted over an 18-month period beginning this week.

LED streetlights are widely popular for their energy efficiency, long lifespans and reduced maintenance requirements. Once complete, the conversion to LEDs will save the municipality about \$5 million a year — savings that will fully fund the conversion work and continue to accrue after the project is paid for.

In 2013, Regional Council directed staff to move ahead with the streetlight conversion to comply with changes to the provincial <u>Energy Efficient</u> <u>Appliances Act</u>. Under the amended legislation, high pressure sodium streetlights are considered inefficient technology that must be replaced on all roadways in Nova Scotia by Dec. 31, 2022.

GJ Cahill and Company Ltd. in Dartmouth has been contracted to replace the streetlights, which are being supplied by the Halifax company, LED Roadway Lighting. The municipal districts furthest from the urban core will be converted first, beginning with the streetlights in District 1 (Waverley-Fall River-Musquodoboit Valley) and District 2 (Preston-Chezzetcook-Eastern Shore).

As they're replaced, each LED streetlight will be equipped with adaptive technology installed by Silver Spring Networks. Once fully implemented, the system will monitor the streetlights in real-time and send alerts when maintenance is required, allowing the municipality to better manage streetlight maintenance and eliminating the need for residents to report outages. The old streetlight bulbs will be properly disposed of by Dan-X Recycling in Dartmouth, diverting that waste from the landfill and keeping harmful chemicals out of our environment.

## **Seniors Snow Removal Program**



Registration for the Seniors' Snow Removal Program has started. The application is available online now at <u>www.ymcahrm.ns.ca</u> and the number to call is 902-483-3678.

**Application Deadline is December** 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015. This is a first come first served process, if the maximum is met before the December 1<sup>st</sup>

deadline the program will close. It is important that only applications with proper documentation will be considered for the program.

# **Residential Property Tax Exemption**

The program is now open for the current 2015/16 fiscal year.

Halifax Regional Municipality can help homeowners pay their property tax through a payment plan, a property tax rebate, or deferral of property taxes (payment is put off to a later date). These programs are available to all homeowners with a combined household income of \$32,000 or less a year who live within the boundary of Halifax Regional Municipality. There are different programs to choose from depending on a person's needs. It is important that you know what choices exist. You can have your exemption award direct deposited to your bank account by completing the Electronic Payment Registration Form and returning it with your application and a **Void Cheque**. The 2015-16 Residential Property Tax Exemption Application form and a Guide are available each year from HRM Customer Service Centers, the HRM Call Centre, the HRM Financial Services Department and on this website. Each year an advertisement is placed in the newspaper to inform the public that the program is open for applications. After you have filed your personal income tax for the current income tax year 2014 filed in April 2015 and have received the Notice of Assessment back from Canada Customs and Revenue Agency confirming your income, you can then complete your application.

A copy of this must be submitted with your application form as confirmation of income is required.
