

Help Shape the Future of HRP



Halifax Regional Police (HRP) is planning for the future and looking to HRM citizens for their input.

October 3rd marked the official launch of the Reenvision Project, an initiative designed to help HRP develop its 10-year strategic plan. Throughout the month of October, citizens will have the opportunity to voice their opinions on a number of topics: their perception of crime in HRM; the role they want HRP to play in the community; the services and approaches to policing that are currently working, need improvement or are lacking altogether; their level of trust in police; and what HRP can do to increase or sustain that level of trust.

This public engagement will include an online survey for citizens and a separate online survey for HRP employees. Citizens and employees can also provide input through social media, email and traditional mail. Once the feedback has been collected, collated and analyzed, themes will be identified and communicated back to our citizens and employees. This information will help shape HRP's ten-year strategic plan. The plan will then support, direct and guide the department for the next decade of policing throughout HRM.

Snow Removal for Seniors & Persons with Disabilities

The snow removal program is available to seniors (65 years of age or older) and persons with disabilities in the Halifax Regional Municipality. The



program applies to residential properties only – commercial properties are ineligible. The program is NOT available to landlords.

You must reside in a single dwelling home that you own or rent.

The total gross household income of all people living on the premises must not exceed \$30,000.

The program offers assistance to clear snow from steps and walkways. This includes:

- front and back steps
- > walkways
- access to fuel tanks

Nocturne 2013 – Oct 19th!




