

# **Emera Oval Update**



Unseasonably warm temperatures in the last few weeks created very challenging conditions to maintain a quality skating surface on the Emera Oval, leading to the end of ice skating for the winter season. But you can still enjoy the oval in the warmer temperatures. Parks and Recreation staff have worked hard to turn over the oval for

inline skating for residents to enjoy until the end of March Break. Inline skates, helmets and other equipment are available for borrowing onsite in a variety of child and adult size options. # **Halifax Water Seasonal Disinfection Program**

From March 1st – April 30th 2016, Halifax Water will be conducting a two-month trial of the seasonal disinfection program.

The program will shut down the Ultra Violet (UV) light disinfection at the Halifax, Dartmouth, Herring Cove and Eastern Passage wastewater treatment facilities. This trial aims to reduce electricity, lower greenhouse gas emissions, allow for maintenance and potentially extend UV equipment lifespan. The Halifax Regional Municipality is reminding residents that only large paper bags will be accepted for curbside collection of excess leaf and yard waste. The municipality did allow for both paper and plastic bags for curbside collection during the fall 2015 until local retailers could ensure an adequate supply of the large paper bags were available to customers. Leaf and yard waste can also be placed in the green bin, only excess material is required to be contained in large paper bags. ## **Ferry Naming Contest Winner**

The votes are in, and our new ferry has a name! Viola Desmond was the winner of the latest Halifax Transit ferry naming contest.

Viola Desmond was born and raised in Halifax. Her story highlighted the need to address segregation in Canada and raised awareness of the African Canadian situation nationally and internationally when she unknowingly sat in the Whites only section of a movie theatre that practiced segregation. She was not permitted to stay, and was detained overnight although she offered to pay the extra required to sit in this section.

Viola Desmond will now be submitted to Transport Canada for consideration and final approval as the name of the new ferry. This is the final of three new vessels that will replace aging infrastructure in the fleet of five harbour ferries. The Viola Desmond ferry is set to go into service this summer.
