
Summertime has finally arrived and I'm looking forward to taking advantage of the good weather by exploring our districts' natural beauty and seeing you at our upcoming community events.








HAMMONDS PLAINS MEMORIAL CENOTAPH



HAMMONDS PLAINS AREA RATE

The Hammonds Plains Common Area Tax Rate exists to provide funding to organized community groups for common amenities within the community of Hammonds Plains. In the past, funding has been used for improving playgrounds, sports fields, parks and community facilities. In October 2015, Regional Council approved using \$75,000 of this fund towards the construction of the new veterans monument in Uplands Park. The area tax rate is charged to all residential and resource properties within the mapped area shown below. Therefore, the funds must be used within this area. The annual property tax rate is \$5.00 for each \$100,000 of taxable assessment. Community groups requiring funding for projects should submit details including cost estimates to Deputy Mayor Matt Whitman's office. Requests will then be brought forward to North West Community Council for consideration. For more details, see our website http://www.halifax.ca/taxes/TaxBill/Rates.php.



STORMWATER RIGHT-OF-WAY CHARGE

Right of Way and Site Generated Flow Charge Stormwater billing have been a contentious issue in our district. In 2014, I was the sole councillor to vote against both levying the Right-of-Way Stormwater Charge and requesting that the fee be collected by Halifax Water. After hearing further feedback from residents and attending various community meetings, I voted in favour with my colleagues to move this fee onto property tax bills of residents in the Stormwater Service Area to more accurately reflect the basis of the charge on June 23rd, 2015.
