Halifax Transit is looking to recruit bus operators. The jobs will be posted from April $12^{th} - 26^{th}$ and information sessions are being held this week.



The Last Treasure Hunter

Spend an hour in the company of a true adventurer at the J.D. Shatford Memorial Library on Wednesday April 5th at 7:00 p.m. Months before Nova Scotia repealed the controversial NS Treasure Trove Act, Terry Dwyer was issued the last official 'treasure trove license'. Learn how his team located the remains of the privately owned British transport ship *Sovereign* in one of the most remote and hostile areas of Nova Scotia, St. Paul Island - the infamous "Graveyard of the Gulf" - just as the weather window closed in on them. The *Sovereign* was rumored to be carrying over 200,000 silver coins at the time it was wrecked near the end of the War of 1812. Ferry Naming Contest

Halifax Transit is once again asking residents to submit suggestions to name its newest replacement harbour ferry vessels, expected to be delivered in fall 2017 and summer 2018.

Submit your name ideas for the two new replacement vessels <u>online</u> by April 14th. Staff and a Council selection committee will review the submissions and narrow them down to a short list based on appropriateness, originality, cultural significance and diversity.

Residents will have the chance to vote on the top selections in the spring, and the top two names receiving the most votes will adorn the new ferries. The residents who submitted the winning names will receive a one-year conventional transit pass courtesy of Halifax Transit.
