Clean Across Nova Scotia – Sackville Spring Sweep

On Saturday, April 20th, a team of approximately 30 volunteers from the community collected about 75 bags of garbage from Sackville Drive and Glendale Drive. The Clean Across Nova Scotia initiative, which is a province wide clean up event, was a huge success not only in Lower Sackville, but provincially as well. I would like to thank everyone who came out to help with the clean-up.

Solid Waste System Review

In 2012, Regional Council directed staff to review the efficiency of the current solid waste system - without compromising environmental or community protections. Council will not make any decisions until all the facts from the review are provided to citizens and they have the opportunity to give their feedback through an extensive consultation process. The public feedback will then be taken back to Council for their review and consideration.

As part of this review, Regional Council approved the staff recommendation to hire Stantec Consulting to evaluate the operation and viability of the Otter Lake Landfill. To verify the science behind the Stantec report, SNC Lavalin conducted a peer review.

The consultant's recommendations outline an evolution of HRM's solid waste system that enhances environmental stewardship through increased diversion and reduced negative environmental impacts.
