Open Space: Cole Harbour Basin Project Update

Cole Harbour Basin Study has been moving forward at a steady pace in order to prepare a document that is easy to use. The Public Engagement Process that wrapped up at the end of 2011 had quite an impact on the analysis component of the study. Staff has been working closely with Stakeholders and the Technical Team on the details of the 13 validated projects in order to test policy and then draft policy guidelines to inform decision makers on where in the Green, Blue, and Grey colour spectrum HRM should invest. Citizen values that include cultural identity, sustainability, good stewardship, and connectivity still resonate loud and clear and show that they help form the pillars of a livable society. Staff is looking forward to being able to present the study conclusions to the Steering Committee and the residents of the Cole Harbour Basin this autumn.
